## AMALGAMATED PROVES SENSATION OF THE WEEK MANHATTAN DISTRICT

Special to the Bonanza.

MANHATTAN, Sept. 28.—The big sensation of the week is the Manhattan Amalgamated.

For several days the richest kind of rock has been hoisted from the slope above the 100-foot level and below the 75.

September 20 Superintendent Walter Wilson took a sample across four feet, which was the first assay giving an inkling of the great news to be divulged and the result was \$744 a ton.

The next day bucket samples from 44 buckets assayed \$575.20.

From 29 buckets the following day the assay was \$159.

September 24 from 12 buckets \$642 was the assay.

Each day since then some three or four tons of the same high-grade ore has been hoisted. On the dump are 40 tons of the stuff that is well assorted up with that character of dope.

The rich stuff comes from three streaks that range from 6 to 18

inches in width.

As a result of this strike Mr. Wilson estimates that the whole ledge, which is eight feet wide, will break at the rate of \$20 a ton. With that quantity and backs blocked out from the 150 to the 75-foot level there is a lot for the mill to do.

The rich find was made directly beneath where Kendall and Douglas, when they operated a lease on the Amalgamated, stoped their ore above the 75.
