A Quiet Campaign

The voters of Nye county are witnessing one of the most unique campaigns ever waged in this section. With hardly an exception, the candidates of both republican and democratic parties are paying very little attention to their political fences, devoting their time principally to the conducting of business affairs.

Such a campaign as this should be encouraged by the voters of this county. The absence of a campaign, such as have been witnessed in the past years when candidates visited every camp in the county and talked politics before every bar, effects a material saving for both candidates and voters. Under present conditions the voters have an opportunity to calmly discuss the merits of the respective candidates, while under the former system, efficiency and capability failed to count, popularity serving instead to secure the necessary votes for election.

It has frequently happened that a candidate for county office would spend a year's salary to secure the election. The candidates for legislative office always spent their salary in conducting a campaign and very few cases are on record wherein a member of the legislature quit ahead of the game. The only instance where it could be considered they were ahead of the game would be when they were richer in experience, but poorer in pocket.

Without the necessity of conducting an expensive campaign better men can be induced to accept nominations for responsible offices. To make a thorough campaign of this county necessitates the expenditure of an enormous sum and the consumption of several weeks' time. This year the majority of the candidates are short on time, their business affairs necessitating their presence every day, while as to funds, the candidate with an over-abundance has failed as yet to make his appearance.

Democratic Inconsistency

Several members of the democratic state press are giving considerable space to the announcements that no mud slinging is being indulged in this year by the republican and democratic candidates for the United States senate. At the same time they are using their editorial columns for the purpose of indulging in personalities against Senator Massey.

This kind of campaign can never win votes and the sooner the democratic papers realize their error, the better it will be for them. Senator Massey is conducting a clean-cut campaign, and in all the republican papers of the state there has not been one personal item directed against his opponent. Past experience has proved that the voters of Nevada prefer a campaign without mudslinging, and the words of approval that have greeted Senator Massey assure the junior United States senator of this state that he will be returned to office on election day by a handsome majority.

Money for the Farmers

The value of the recent snowfall in Nye county can be counted up in thousands of dollars for every inch. For the past three or four winters the snowfall has been somewhat light and as a consequence water has been scarce in the districts devoted to agriculture. Even in Tonopah the water shortage is noticeable. The water supply for this city comes from the Rye Patch district where it is pumped from wells. The drainage area in that district covers miles and is supposed to be supplied from the winter's snow.

Considerable discomfort has been caused by the snow and hardships have been experienced by prospectors. However, when it is realized that thousands of dollars will be the gain by the agriculturists of this county as the direct result of the snowfall, the discomfort experienced is as nothing in comparison.
