The mining laws of the United States will be revised, there being a universal demand for changing many of the obsolete statutes. Senator W. A. Massey, by reason of his chairmanship of the committee on mines and mining of the United States senate, will largely direct these changes and amendments, a fact which will prove of great interest to every man engaged in mining not only in Nevada but the entire west.

Senator Massey is the only man in the United States senate who can speak authoritatively upon matters affecting precious metal mining, and it was a signal tribute to his reputation as a practical and legal authority on mining that he was selected to head this most important committee. Heretofore it had not been customary to recognize so readily a new member in the upper house, but Senator Massey's name had preceded him.

It will be recalled that another Nevadan, the late Senator William A. Stewart, was the author of many of the mining laws still in force. These statutes were enacted when the Comstock was young, and they have served ever since, although amended frequently in after years. It is of vast importance to Nevada that any changes in the mining laws be presented to the congress by Senator Massey, who, having been a practical miner in his younger days, subsequently brought to the legal profession that experience so rarely combined in litigation affecting mining.

The bureau of mines, created through the efforts of the then congressman from Nevada, George A. Bartlett, is being developed rapidly, and, an appropriation of \$100,000 having been obtained to investigate the treatment of low-grade ores in the west, this branch of the department of the interior will be an important factor in the development of the mining industry. Some of the most active men in support of the bureau of mines in the congress, besides Senator Massey, are Congressman Roberts of Nevada and Congressman John E. Raker of the first district of California, well known in this state. Massey was a miner, Roberts is the only member of the Western Federation of Miners in congress, and Congressman Raker has been identified with mining in Modoc county, California.

### The World's Series

Interest in the games de luxe this year is unusual, because the Red Sox are comparatively an unknown quantity. For years the games have been between teams led by Frank Chance, Connie Mack, John J. But what Stahl's men will do in a crucial series with the eyes of the baseball world upon them is a matter that cannot accurately be predicted. During the American league season now closed they have relied on terrific batting to win their battles. Their play, with the exception of a rather fast outfield, has not been much above mediocre. McGraw has won the pennant with his great staff of pitchers and fast work on the base lines. The two teams are the leading exponents of two diametrically opposite schools of baseball.

## MANY MINERS ARE NOW WORKING AT KLONDYKE

### NICK KOSICH IS READY TO MAKE SECOND ORE SHIPMENT FROM HIS LEASE

Fifty miners are now employed at the camp of Klondyke, midway between Tonopah and Goldfield, according to Nick Kosich, who is leasing in that district and was in Tonopah yesterday after supplies. Mr. Kosich departed for his lease this morning.

One shipment of ore has been made by Mr. Kosich and he is now about ready to send a second shipment of 35 tons to the Hazen sampler. He declares the entire district a scene of great activity and is firm in his belief that before many days elapse many of the leasers will be shipping pay ore in good quantities. On his lease Mr. Kosich has three miners employed, in addition to working himself, and has just started to reap a small profit from his labors.

The Goldfield Tribune of yesterday has the following to say of the Klondyke district:

Some excellent assays have been secured by Charles A. Woodruff from samples of gold-silver ore secured from the vein recently opened by his men on the property, situated in the Klondyke district, which he is operating under bond and lease. One of the assays received from Downer brothers yesterday yielded \$225.95 per ton, mostly in silver. Mr. Woodruff has also opened another vein which carries ore of good quality and that from which the high assays were obtained appears to be making into a deposit of some size.

This is a white-sugar quartz in which there are seams and chunks of nearly pure black metal or horn-silver. A shaft has been sunk at the bottom of the gulch from which a large amount of placer gold was taken many years ago at a depth of 50 feet a crosscut passed through the porphyry contact but has not produced anything of commercial value here. There is a constant increase in mining activity throughout the Klondyke district and some ore of excellent grade is being shipped by operators and lessees.
