PLATFORM ADOPTED BY REPUBLICANS SHOULD BE READ BY ALL VOTERS

The republican candidates of Nye county assembled in convention, pursuant to the provisions of the primary law, offer no program that is not bulwarked with performances; makes no promises but what are for the interest of the tax payers and property owners of this county.

The past four years of republican rule in this nation has been such that we again give our hearty endorsement to the platform and candidates presented by the national republican convention. Good Roads

We pledge our county and legislative candidates to adopt every means whereby the roads of this county will be repaired and new thoroughfares constructed. Primary Election Law

We pledge our legislative candidates to the enactment of sweeping amendments to the present primary law, which in its self is nothing short of farcial. We favor such amendments that will prohibit voters from flocking from one standard to another without a declaration of their political faith. We believe in the sanctity of the ballot and urge that secrecy be continued, but are opposed to the present construction of the primary law that allows fraud being perpetrated.

Free Text Books

We pledge our legislative candidates to labor for the passage of a measure providing for the furnishing of free text books by the state to the pupils attending our public schools.

TAFT APPEARS TO BE FAVORITE LOCAL VOTERS

WILD APPLAUSE GREET'S PICTURE OF PRESIDENT ON THEATER CURTAIN

William Howard Taft appears to be the favorite of the Tonopah voters, and if indications can be counted, the president will receive a substantial majority of the votes cast in this city on November 5.

At the Butler theater last night slides portraying the four presidential candidates appeared upon the curtain. First on the list was shown the pictures of Debs and Seidel, the socialist candidates. A fairly strong ripple of applause resulted. The picture of Roosevelt and Johnson came next and a half hearted whistle that came from a small boy in the front row was all the applause given the progressive candidates. Woodrow Wilson was next and he failed to receive even the echo of the whistle. President Taft was shown last and then the entire house joined in the applause. Men, women and children joined in and the hand clapping lasted for several minutes.

According to the amount of applause bestowed upon the candidates Taft will run first in Tonopah. Debs will run second while Roosevelt and Wilson will tie for the third honors.
