

COAST PIONEER PASSES ONWARD TO LAST REST

GREELY FRENCH SUCCEUMS TO ATTACK OF HEART FAILURE AT SILVER CITY

Greely French, a pioneer of Nevada and California, passed away at his home in Silver City Thursday, the result of a sudden attack of heart failure.

French came to Nevada in 1861, two years after he had arrived in California, coming around the Horn on a sailing vessel. After following mining in the golden state he located at Virginia City, and had lived in Storey at Silver City, where he had a number of mining interests, and in which district he accumulated a small sized fortune. Besides his interests there, he had become interested in a number of other mining investments in different parts of the state.

Greely French was a native of Salisbury, Merrimac county, N. H. Besides his wife he leaves to mourn his loss two daughters, Mrs. P. S. Greeley of Sparks and Mrs. W. H. Bonham of Silver City. Funeral arrangements have not yet been announced.

LAWYERS FOR BANK RECEIVER GET BIG FEES

JUDGE LANGAN ALLOWS ATTORNEYS' BILL IN STATE BANK AND TRUST LITIGATION

Judge Langan Friday heard the claim of the firm of Mack, Green & Heer for legal fees as attorneys for the receiver, Frank Wildes, on the State Bank and Trust company, and allowed the claim of \$30,000 for four years and seven months' work. This includes some \$12,500 previously drawn for attorneys' fees, traveling expenses and other expenses.

Attorneys Steffan of Virginia City and W. D. Jones of Reno testified before Judge Langan as to the reasonableness of the fees demanded.


