LITIGATION HILL LEASE HAS GOOD ORE BODY AT A DEPTH OF 415 FEET

Special to the Bonanza

MANHATTAN, Nov. 15.—At a depth of 415 feet the new ledge of the Litigation Hill Leasing company is all in ore, the same as it has been continuously since the rich 6-foot ledge was tapped by a west drift at the 385-foot level. Just how large the ore body at present may be is a matter of mere conjecture, but it is a certainty that it is no smaller than when found, as such would be disclosed by its narrowing up in the shaft, which it has shown no tendency to do.

Sinking is proceeding at a rate of three to four feet a day on an average. Superintendent J. G. Cushing states that the ore is much softer than any of the surrounding material, which is the hardest kind of lime, and is softer than most any other known ore in the camp. Thus sinking the shaft is made easy and it is proceeding more than twice as fast as otherwise it could. This is accomplished without a compressor or machine drills.

This has the further advantage of causing the ore dump to grow with double the rapidity anticipated and it will be but a week or two until a 300-ton mill will be treated at the War Eagle mill. The ore is being hauled and placed in bins at the mill to await an accumulation of that amount, when milling of it will begin. It will be by far the largest shipment yet made from that lease, either under the present or the former ownership. The last one was 190 tons and gave an average return of \$25 a ton. The present one should go about the same easily, and under the same circumstances would be a more profitable ore to mine, for one reason that the ledge is large and another that everything goes for ore as it is broken down without the least sorting.
