TWO SENATORS WILL HANDLE ALL POST OFFICES

POSTOFFICE PATRONAGE WILL BE TAKEN AWAY FROM CONGRESSMAN ROBERTS

Postoffice patronage in Nevada, according to a Washington dispatch to the Sacramento Bee which is in confirmation of rumors heard here, is to be handled hereafter by two democratic senators from Nevada the privilege of recommending appointees which was given to Congressman E. E. Roberts during his last term to revert to Senator Newlands and Senator-elect Key Pittman. There are numerous selections for fourth class offices in Nevada, but only a few appointments in which confirmation by the senate is required, and the dates of expirations of commissions in these instances are advanced in most cities. NEW AUTO TRUCK CARRIES FREIGHT TO MANHATTAN

SECOND PIERCE-ARROW MACHINE IS PURCHASED BY WITTENBERG COMPANY

The new Pierce-Arrow five-ton auto truck recently purchased by the Wittenberg Warehouse company, was given its first trial yesterday when it hauled a load of freight to Manhattan and Round Mountain. The truck worked without trouble and will see steady service henceforth.

This makes the second truck to be placed in commission by Charles F. Wittenberg in hauling freight to the northern camps, daily trips having been made for the last year with the first truck purchased. The new machine has a larger bed than the old one and will be able to carry an additional load. It is planned to keep the trucks working all winter, should the roads remain in condition.

Four Pierce-Arrow trucks are now in commission in Tonopah, two being used by the Wittenberg company and two by the West End company.
