## The Aggregate Vote

There is continued inquiry about the total vote cast at the late presidential election. The official returns collected by the Associated Press and probably approximately correct, show that Wilson polled for president 6,303,963 votes; Taft polled 3,439,529; Roosevelt polled 4,168,564; the socialists 898,119; the prohibitionists 293,319; the social labor, 29,061. The total vote was 15,041,355. Mr. Wilson had a plurality over the next highest candidate of 2,134,439.

At the presidential election of 1908 the republican vote was 7,678,908; the democratic, 6,409,104; the socialist, 420,793; the prohibitionists, 253,840; the people's party, 29,100; the social labor, 13,825; the independent, 82,872. The total popular vote in 1908 for all candidates was 14,888,442.

The gain in total vote, therefore, this year over 1908 is 153,213. But there was in fact a considerable falling off in place of a gain; for the new states of New Mexico and Arizona cast an aggregate of 73,098 votes. Women voted for the first time in California and Washington. In California the total vote in 1908 was 386,597; at the election of last November it was 673,497, an increase of 286,900. In Washington the vote of 1908 was 193,879; at the election of last November it was 322,799, an increase of 128,920. In both cases the chief increase was undoubtedly in the woman vote. But counting it all as added votes, the aggregate of this increase was 415,820, so that the increase by woman suffrage and by the admission of two states was 488,918.

Reckoned on the same basis as the vote of 1908, the shrinkage in the total vote this year amounts to 335,705. And this in spite of the whirlwind campaign, the vehement uproar, and the anguished outcry that the republic was about to be submerged in a wave of commercial robbery. It is evident that the people did not take seriously the demagogic uproar and the beating of tom-toms; and this in itself speaks loudly for the stability of the popular mind and the perpetuity of the republic.

## Famine In Potatoes

The United States government has established a quarantine against potatoes from England, Scotland, Ireland, Germany, Austria and Newfoundland. The purpose is to safeguard the native spuds from potato canker. It is estimated that American growers will have to produce ten million more bushels in the coming year to make up for the excluded imports.

The chances are strong that whatever our farmers do, this affliction of the poor will not be mended. Under our system of food distribution (or lack of it) there is usually enough of a potato crop in America to supply it, were it capable of movement automatically to its places of need. But so organized are middlemen, so unorganized the growers, and so greedy the railroads that tens of thousands of bushels of potatoes rot in the ground and in bins.

The poor will as assuredly suffer from the potato shortage as the jobber will benefit from stiffened prices. Nothing else could happen in a country where it is a custom of commission merchants in cities to destroy farm produce to maintain prices.

The news of the potato is particularly unfortunate. It is the best and kindest of vegetables. An excellent "mixer," it nourishes the high and the low. It blesses the earth that gives it life, leaving it better for other crops. Its charity and good nature long ago passed into a proverb: The stupidest farmers have the biggest potatoes. The poor housewife knows it for a faithful friend. Of all the products of the soil it could least be spared.
