

EUREKA PIONEER ENDS HIS LIFE BY SHOOTING

News was received in Eureka Thursday by Eureka lodge No. 16, F. & A. M., announcing the death in San Francisco that day of Walter J. Tonkin, a former Eureka resident and a member of this lodge. The Eureka lodge immediately notified Masonic officers in San Francisco of Mr. Tonkin's death and requested that order to act for it in communicating with the family and arranging for the funeral.

On Friday morning the Sentinel received a telegram from San Francisco stating that Walter J. Tonkin had committed suicide by shooting himself in the head at the Cassioma apartments at 902 Pine street Thursday morning at 11 o'clock. The telegram further stated that business reverses was thought to be the cause of him taking his life.

Mr. Tonkin was one of the pioneer residents of Eureka county, coming here in the early days. He worked in the mines on Ruby hill for several years. Later he conducted a saloon and wholesale liquor business in Eureka, which he disposed of when he engaged in ranching and stock raising at Tonkin, Eureka county, the postoffice there now bearing his name. Subsequently he sold this ranch property to the Damele brothers, who are now conducting it, and returned to Eureka and engaged in the dry good and clothing business. He was married and raised his family here, leaving with them for Virginia City, about eight years ago, where he had property and re-engaged in business. About a year ago he disposed of his business at Virginia City and went to San Francisco and purchased an interest in the Cadillac hotel in that city, which he and his family have since conducted.

Besides his widow, he is survived by two grown children, Walter C. and Celia Tonkin, all residing in San Francisco. He was a native of England and aged 59 years.

The Nevada friends of the deceased and his family will regret his passing away as he did and will extend to the family their sincere sympathy in the hour of their bereavement.--Eureka Sentinel.

LOST ON DESERT FOR TWO DAYS ON WAY TO ROCHESTER

P. J. Conway arrived in this city Monday morning from Rochester, where he had been on a short investigation tour, says the Carson News. Conway is just recovering from the effects of an experience which few men would have lived through. Conway, in company with Harry Warren of Mason valley, left Fallon in an auto for Lovelock and after being out a short distance found themselves fighting through banks of mud. They kept on their way until night overtook them and the machine quit. They spent the night in the machine and after several hours' work in the morning found they could do nothing with the machine and that it would be necessary for one of them to go for help. Warren, who is a trained athlete, started on foot for Lovelock. Conway was taken ill and knowing that Warren would have to walk 30 or 40 miles before he could get help, decided to follow along and make his way as best he could. All the day and night Conway traveled through the alkali mud of the Humboldt desert, losing the trail made by Warren, and at last finding himself wandering into the desert again. He was faint for the lack of food and water, but kept his nerve. Miles away he could see a flickering light and he made his way toward it. The Humboldt river was between him and the light and after considerable difficulty he was able to cross the river on the ice. At midnight of the second night, Conway reached a small ranch house, where he was taken in and cared for, being in an almost exhausted condition.

Paddy Conway was known to most of the old timers of this section, he having been one of the central figures of the Sweetwater country, beyond Hawthorne for the last 20 years. Mrs. Conway is a sister of Milton Ish, the violinist of Goldfield, who recently resigned a position in the Consolidated mill, for the purpose of establishing a new home in the suburbs of Oakland, Cal. According to report Conway is worth anywhere from \$100,000 to \$300,000.
