NEW TODAY

ORDINANCE NO. 23... An Ordinance to Fix and Collect a License Tax Upon and Regulate Solicitors Within the Town of Tonopah. Be it ordained by the Board of County Commissioners of Nevada, Nevada, sitting as a Town Board, as follows: Section 1. Every person or firm engaged in the business of soliciting the purchase of goods, wares or merchandise within the limits of the town of Tonopah, from places beyond the limits of said town, or upon orders to be filled elsewhere than in said town; and every person bargaining or selling any goods, wares or merchandise, by sample or otherwise, in said town, shall be deemed a solicitor and shall pay, quarterly for a license to carry on said business, according to the monthly receipts or sales of such solicitor, as in the following schedule: First Class—Monthly receipts or sales, five thousand dollars or over, quarterly license, twenty-five dollars. Second Class—Monthly receipts or sales, four thousand dollars or over, quarterly license, twenty dollars. Third Class—Monthly receipts or sales, three thousand dollars or over, quarterly license, fifteen dollars. Fourth Class—Monthly receipts or sales, two thousand dollars or over, quarterly license, ten dollars. Fifth Class—Monthly receipts or sales, under two thousand dollars, quarterly license, five dollars. Sec. 2. Any person, firm, association or corporation, who shall be engaged in the business of solicitor within the limits of the town of Tonopah, without first having taken out a license therefor, and upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding three hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail for a term not exceeding one hundred and fifty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Sec. 3. All licenses issued under this ordinance shall be paid quarterly, in advance. Dated at Tonopah, Nevada, this 5th day of March, 1913. H. H. DAVIS, W. A. MARSH, ALEX.
