BARNES' BILL CUTTING SALARIES PASSES HOUSE

MEASURE REDUCES WAGES OF CLERK, TREASURER, AUDITOR AND ATTORNEY The bill introduced in the assembly by Barnes of Nye county reducing the salaries of the various county officials, has passed the lower house, according to a letter received by W. J. Stock from Barnes. The measure calls for a reduction of about \$50 monthly in the salaries of the county treasurer, clerk and auditor, district attorney and recorder. The bill now goes to the senate and it is believed similar action will be taken by that body. No mention was made by Barnes of the progress of his bills reducing the salaries of the sheriff and assessor and also of the district judge. However, as both bills have the approval of the Nye county taxpayers it is believed their passage will be accomplished before the final adjournment is taken by the legislature.
