RECOGNITION OF CHINA TO BE ON APRIL EIGHT

SECRETARY BRYAN FORMALLY GIVES NOTICE OF CONTENT-PLATED ACTION. (By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Apr. 3.—Secretary Bryan has formally notified all the diplomatic representatives here of the intention of the United States to recognize the Chinese republic on April 8, the meeting day of the assembly of that country, and has formally proposed that all other governments recognize the new republic on that day.

JURY RETURNS VERDICT FAVOR OF DEFENDANT

INJURED MINER AWARDED \$1,000

PREDICT IS REACHED IN DAMAGE SUIT HEARD IN RENO DISTRICT COURT. THREE YEARS IS SENTENCE FOR MRS. PANKHURST

MILITANT LEADER IS FOUND GUILTY OF INCITING FOLLOWERS TO RIOT. (By Associated Press) LONDON, Apr. 3.—Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst, the leader militant of the suffragettes, was found guilty at the Old Bailey sessions today and sentenced to three years penal servitude, on a charge of inciting persons to commit damage.

PASSENGER RECORDS BROKEN.

ST. PAUL, Minn., Apr. 3.—More than 300,000 persons passed through St. Paul terminals for the northwest during the month of March, according to figures given out by railroad officials here today. This breaks all records, with an average of 275 trains per day. The number of cars carrying settlers' effects was more than double last year's figures.
