**QUARANTINE IS  
ESTABLISHED ON  
OUTSIDE BEES**

CATTLE AND ALFALFA HAY MUST  
ALSO BE INSPECTED BE-  
FORE IMPORTED.

By proclamation of Governor Od-  
die made Saturday, quarantines are  
established in Nevada against the im-  
portation from any state in the union  
of any cattle for breeding or dairy  
purposes which have not been in-  
spected for tuberculosis, any horses  
or mules which have not been in-  
spected for glanders or malade du  
coit, or any bees which have not been  
inspected for American, European or  
foul brood.

A third quarantine prohibits the im-  
portation into this state from certain  
districts of Utah, Wyoming, or Idaho  
of any alfalfa hay, it having been  
made to appear that the farming in-  
dustry of the state is endangered by  
such importation because of the ex-  
istence of alfalfa weevil in the dis-  
tricts named. The districts are all  
that certain portion of the state of  
Utah lying between the 39th and 42d  
parallels of latitude and between the  
111th and 113th degrees of longitude;  
Oneida and Bear Lake counties in  
Idaho, and Uinta in Wyoming.

will marry the Rev. Charles E. Ed-  
wards of Peoria, Ill., and her sister  
will wed the Rev. Frank R. Cle-  
land of St. Louis.

**TRACTS COST \$700,000  
SELL FOR \$2,500,000**

WINNIPEG, May 12—Lacey & Co.  
of Chicago have sold Lillooet river  
tracts to the Deere Plow company  
of Moline, Ill., for \$2,500,000. The  
property was sold on a basis of \$3  
a 1000 feet on an approved cruise  
showing the standing timber to be  
70,000,000 feet, mostly cedar and fir.  
The area of the tract is about 10,794  
acres. Less than a year ago the  
former owners bought the same lum-  
ber for the Shevlin estate for \$700,000  
cash.
