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Vindication of Tonopah

Experience is a cruel master. When he whips his whip over the shoulders of his followers the crack of the lash always brings blood and leaves seared and scarred flesh to remind one of the encounter. It is said that a burned child dreads the fire, but this impressive lesson of infancy is not always remembered by those who are brought in contact with the seamy side of life. With the speculator and inventor it is the same way. They never seem to remember what they have gone through, but are impelled by hope to venture into water beyond their depth.

In the speculative world Tonopah offers an apt illustration. Time and time again short sellers of local stocks have been burned to the bone, but they have no sooner recovered from their injuries than they rush back to the same old game, as the moth gravitates to the light of the candle and falls a victim to its own folly. From the day when Belmont began its ascension and the stock rose from 62 cents to \$11.75, the market has been the scene of many notable attempts to hammer prices and destroy values. The Tonopah crowd has, with a solitary exception, always been on the bull side, filled with optimism and guided by first knowledge of conditions obtained from the fountain head. At the source of the stream the water is purest, and then it is up to the man himself what application he can make of his information. Belmont was derided as a wildcat and the report of the finding of the lost ledge was taken with a big dose of salt. Outsiders who shorted need not be reminded of their misery. Other properties have had a similar story to relate. When the Merger came in it became an object of a wild attack, but the stock went to \$1.87 1/2 before the reaction ensued that sent it back below a dollar. Whatever manipulation may have been instrumental in boosting that stock is a matter of history that can be overlooked since the property was brought into the productive stage and added to the list of shippers. This is all the management requires to prove the legitimate character of its work. The doings of speculators had no influence with the management, which went ahead developing and bringing that estate into the lists where dividends became a matter of time.

Once more, when the market was in the dumps, North Star pulled it out of the hole and imparted fresh resiliency to the entire list. The ore was there and the universal hope is that, with proper direction, the ore body may be recovered and a reserve of backs shown to the satisfaction of competent engineers that will demonstrate the fact that the property will eventually regain its lost prestige. The latest discovery, that of Midway, is one that is in safe hands that have not been soiled by a maniacal desire to make a record regardless of the physical condition of the ground. Statements from the Midway have been forthcoming at all times on the inquiry of stockholders, and there does not appear to have been any aching for notoriety to cause a coloring of the facts to the detriment of those whose money has been entrusted to the Broughtier interests.

There is no doubt the existence of a giant cabal in San Francisco to hammer Tonopah stocks to a fraction of their real value, but in every case these unprincipled adventurers have been caught in the swirl of their own perfidy and dragged down to financial ruin. It is a comparatively easy matter to short a stock if you have the money to hold on and browbeat those who are banking on the merits of a property, but when a property is handled with conservatism, and the officers are known not to be active in the speculative field, it is a safe inference that those who short stocks will have to face the music by either waiting for the final settlement or taking their losses early in the game. At the opening of Monday's market it was apparent that a concerted attack had been planned against the Tonopah stocks, and the ending can be only a matter of surmise, since it aborted in the delivery through the coming in of Midway. Had Midway not been strong, it is probable that the bottom would have been knocked out of every holding, with possibly the exception of Tonopah Mining and Belmont, which have passed into the investment stage, and widespread losses would have been entailed.

Once again the machinations of speculation have failed when pitted against the material development of Tonopah, and the faith of Tonopah in its own mines has been vindicated.

Newlands Is Coming

The senator from Chevy Chase is back on the coast, but he is not stopping in his own ballwick, but has gone down to the bay, where he may fraternize with the moneyed interests and hobnob on the coast of campaigning in his pocket borough. Newlands has always bragged of the easy way this state falls for his game and his boasts are warranted by his conduct.
