GOOD EXAMPLE FOR TONOPAH.

THE little town of Mina, which boasts of a few hands full of people, has set an example that Tonopah should be proud to follow. The Mina Mercantile company boldly challenges any mail order house in the United States to fill orders from that section. None is excepted. Prices are right and the Mina Mercantile company, through a four-column space in the Western Nevada Miner, announces that it is eager to have a showdown with mail order houses. Here is an extract from the advertisement of the company:

We Want a Chance to Compete With MAIL ORDER GOODS.

Every miner and buyer in this vicinity that has been purchasing from MAIL ORDER concerns should let us figure before sending his money out of town. WE WILL MEET AND BEAT ANY COMPETITION IN PRICE OR QUALITY OF GOODS.

Orders from surrounding mining camps promptly filled by parcels post.

There is no whining or lamenting about this form of advertising. This is a true Nevada challenge to all comers. These men use printers' ink and they know how to make good use of it. Tonopah could do worse than pattern after the example. The Mina Mercantile company is not an aggregation of mossbacks, such as one concern in this town which is sending out circulars bearing a rubber stamp imprint on the envelope. This is the kind of a firm that is a detriment to the town and one that encourages buyers to send elsewhere for whatever they want. Rubber stamps on mercantile envelopes in this progressive age is like sliding back to the days of tallow candles and stagecoaches.

A JUMBLE OF IDEAS.

THE Admission day proclamation of Governor Oddie will go down to history as one of the worst conglomerations of nonsense issued in this state from an official source. The thought of the greatest event in the career of Nevada is almost lost sight of in a desire to pander to the joy-riders and riotous livers who seek an outlet for their exuberance in chasing from town to town in pursuit of pleasure. The document appears in all papers of the northern counties headed "Lincoln Highway Day Proclamation." Not a word is said about the admission of Nevada to the Union. Instead of commemorating that event with dignity and prayers of thanksgiving, the blessings of the Almighty are invoked for the dedication of a boulevard that will never be built, or, if built, will be monopolized by those reared in the lap of luxury. An analysis of the proclamation is shocking to patriotic people, as it is almost blasphemous in its irreverence.

Let the reader pause to think of a governor dragging his office through the mire piled up by a lot of mechanical mountebanks seeking to swell their own coffers through advertising their wares. Nevada has been degraded too often, and it does not become the chief executive of this state to lower his eminent office by toadying to a lot of automobile builders who have not a dollar invested in this state and who seek simply to use the name of the state to promote their own traffic. It is disgusting to witness such a lowering of honor at a time when the people of Nevada, possibly on the eve of another war, were filled with thoughts of patriotism and love of country.

This is a travesty and libel on the intelligence of Nevada citizens to think they would refrain from the usual exercises that a few manufacturers may sell more motor cars.

The proclamation is a stultifying document at best, issued at the last minute on the eve of the anniversary that is pregnant with important events for the whole nation. The proclamation has not yet reached the Tonopah Bonanza, but the Reno newspapers print what they allege is the exact wording of the document. This came to Tonopah at 11 o'clock on the morning of Admission day, when it could not have been made effective if the people were to wait for the chief executive to remind them of their duty. except from the proclamation that will stand as a supreme effort of monumental dignity.

"It happens that on the evening of this day, in all the cities and towns of all the states through which the proposed Lincoln highway will pass, public services will be held, celebrating the naming of the route and testifying to public co-operation in support of this great beneficial enterprise in memory of Abraham Lincoln and which will bind the nation together in yet closer ties. It is therefore fitting and proper that Nevada, as well, hold such services, and that in such manner we evidence our purpose of realization of this great achievement."

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The reawakening of Rawhide is the message of E. W. King, a prominent mining man from Rawhide. Mr. King stated that the National mill, with 29 stamps, was started Tuesday, and that indications point to a tonnage that will keep them going. On the 400-foot level of the Victor mine they have just encountered a fine shoot of ore. The vein at that point is four and a half feet in width and will run \$20 to the ton, it is believed, although the returns on the assays have not yet been received.
