SERIES OF CAVES FOUND AT MANHATTAN THAT SAVED THE COST OF DRIFTING

Considerable attention has been attracted by the striking of a series of caves in the tunnel in the Train, Todd, Ferguson & Schubert lease on the April Pool, at Manhattan, Nev.

The tunnel was driven in 200 feet in the hill to strike the quartzite-lime contact that was ore bearing on the surface. At a point nearly that distance in a shot broke through into a cavern about fifteen feet in diameter, from which a number of caverns and passages run through the carboniferous limestone for a total distance of about twenty-five feet, as far as explored.

A number of large boulders have dropped from the roof to the floor of the first cavern, which lie so loosely that a person can crawl down between them into other passages. One leads to a large room about thirty feet across, one end of which shows the large ledge of quartz and fluor spar ore that assays \$4 a ton.

A second passage leads for a distance of eighty-five feet up the course of the limestone, and is about the dimensions of a mine raise. Part of this passage is in blue limestone, coated with calcite and gypsum, while about fifteen feet of a side passage discloses that much quartz ore.
