While the tribe was at work on the ikon one of its members, who had served in the British army, paid a visit to his old home, and when he saw what was being done he insisted that it would be the grossest discourtesy to his royal master if a similar gift was not made for King George. The only difference between the two is that the Russian gift is surmounted by the imperial arms of Russia while the English image bears the royal arms of Great Britain.

The ikon is made in the form of a half room with the front elevation surmounted by the royal arms. The figure of the Savior and his disciples about the table are done in full relief in solid mother of pearl.
