ORGIE OF THE BIG MITT.

A RED-TYPED copy of the Denver Times, dated January 30, 1907, over seven years old, fluttered down the street from a porch where they were unpacking household goods just received from the east. The writer picked it up out of curiosity and there in the scarlet letters of Colorado journalism read a series of stories that furnished the keynote to the present appalling situation in that state. The story is told by pen and picture on the first page. The cartoon, four columns wide, represents a dual scene—New York and Colorado. The New York half shows Governor Hughes seated at his desk receiving visitors with the motto, "Government in the Open Only," on the front. The other half represents a bloated political boss halting in amazement at a basement entrance labeled "Backstairs Secret Entrance. Closed. Go to the Front Entrance." Underneath is the line, "A Hughes Reform which the People would like to see Adopted in Colorado."

Flaunting across the seven columns of the same page, in the same vivid ink, is the burning question, "What does a governor govern if he does not govern the whole state? Colorado has statutes. Why not annul them if they are dead letters?" Down at the bottom of the page is a venomous attack on the owner of an opposition sheet who is denounced as a grafter, liar, perjurer and blackmail, all of which must be very edifying to the readers who do not live in Denver and have to rely on local papers for their information. The big head lines describe the opposition editor as man of many aliases. Six of these are given. Incidentally it is added that the paper conducted by this luminous disciple of Colorado journalism is employed chiefly as a means of extorting money from corporations.

Here is the secret of the present internecine war that has backed Mexico off the boards with the distinction of numbering in its list of dead victims scores of women and children instead of soldiers.

After studying this arraignment for a moment the inference is plain. Colorado has been exploited too long by venal legislators, grasping corporations, arrogant labor leaders, unscrupulous newspapers and vainglorious governors who were as putty in the hands of the elements that dictated their election.

Some of these days Colorado voters will learn that honesty is the best policy and the plain people will proceed to scourge the panderers and plunderers from their midst and begin with a clean slate.

KEEPING A GOOD MAN DOWN.

Who are the white-livered Progressives that would nominate the colonel for governor, and let it go at that?

CESSPOOLS ARE A CERTAIN MENACE PUBLIC HEALTH

The danger of cesspools, vaults and other defective drains to public health was recently pointed out in articles appearing in Reno, as well as local papers, which commented upon the fact that twenty-one cases of typhoid fever were traced to one vault in the city of Reno. Such outbreaks are more than liable to happen right in our community at most any time, since the predominance of vaults and cesspools form a constant menace to public health. Conditions existing in many sections of this town are appalling and should have immediate attention, otherwise there is no telling just where the next infections now prevalent in this community might end. The attention of the chief commissioner of the Public Service Commission of Nevada, at the time of his last visit to Tonopah, as well as the chairman of the Board of County Commissioners and the health officer, was directed to a cellar on Main street that is overflowing with the effluvia from a neighboring septic tank and this sickening condition exists at the present time with no apparent relief in sight. Whether this is due to neglect on the part of officials entrusted with the safeguarding of public health or whether the present sanitary laws are inadequate to control a situation of this kind has not been determined, but it is safe to say that something must be done at no distant date if we are to avoid a repetition of the plague that visited our town some few years ago. If existing laws and ordinances were correctly construed it would be an easy matter to distribute more equally the burden of sewage disposal. There can be no logic in a situation that imposes present heavy sewage charges upon the few and leaves to the many a freedom from such a tax and gives them the right to pollute neighborhoods in which others are striving for sanitary conditions. The Public Service Commission of Nevada has brought relief in other instances to this town and has promised further relief in the way of reduced sewage charges providing a more liberal patronage is given to the sewer company. Co-operation on the part of the public in this all important branch of public safety is the only means of reducing the individual charge and at the same time help to reduce the doctor bills.
