MARINE DISASTERS IN CANADA CAUSE BIG LOSS OF LIFE

FORTY SCHOONERS AND TWENTY MEN SACRIFICED TO FURY OF STORM.

(By Associated Press.) QUEBEC, June 8.—Forty schooners were wrecked and twenty or more fishermen lost their lives in a storm that swept the coast of northern New Brunswick and Bay of Chaleurs Friday night. Nearly all boats were blown ashore at Miscou and Shippegan islands, remote points from which the news came slowly.
