RUSSO-TURKISH WAR.

FIGHTING has already begun between the Russians and Turks in trans-Caucasia. This is a region south of the Caucasus mountains extending from the Black to the Caspian sea a distance of about 450 miles.

Trans-Caucasia is the only territory connecting the Russian and Turkish empires, and therefore the only region by which land forces can invade either empire. The only other method of attacking Russia is by way of the Black sea, where the Turko-German fleet has already inflicted some losses upon the Russians. Should the Turks be able to seize trans-Caucasia they would come into possession of the vast and highly productive oil fields in the province of Baku. This would be a precious prize for the Germans and Austrians, who are said to have lost their chief source of oil supply when the Russians took the territory in Galicia surrounding the city of Lemberg.

Even if the Turks should be successful in trans-Caucasia, it is not likely that they would go beyond the Caucasus mountains for any great distance, for an invasion of Russia would be unavailing. The chief purpose of Turkish hostilities is to create a diversion which will keep as many thousand Russian troops as possible away from the firing line in Galicia and East Prussia. The Germans and Austrians hope that Turkey will be able to exert enough pressure not only upon Russia, but England and France, to weaken, or at all events to prevent from growing stronger, the forces now engaging the Germans and Austrians in the eastern and western theaters of war. They take the chance, however, of involving the Balkan states and Italy on the side of the allies and thus nullifying whatever power the Turks and Mohammedans generally can exercise.

A dispatch from Berlin states that Turkey will not stir up any trouble in Tripoli, and that, therefore, Italy has nothing to fear. It may be that the war office in Berlin believes diplomacy can circumscribe the limits of a fanatical holy war but to the casual observer it would appear as if a holy war, once begun, cannot easily be limited by agreements between governments.

RENO AN UNDESIRABLE.

DAILY SPORTING LETTER

Football affairs have reached such a state that when the referee's whistle sent the various gridiron gladiators into battle today only a few teams in each section of the country remained in the fight for the sectional championships. It was more than likely that before the twilight shadows settled over the land the number of contenders would be fewer.

In the east only the University of Pittsburg and the Army eleven remain unbeaten or untied. Harvard and Princeton have not been beaten, but both have been tied by the so-called "weaker" elevens. Pittsburg today tackles the wonderful Washington and Jefferson team and it will be the supreme test for the plucky Smoky City eleven.

Harvard and Princeton fight it out in Cambridge, with the chances favoring Harvard, because the Crimson eleven has come forward with a rush during the past two weeks, while Princeton seems to have been doing what Jeffries did. The Tigers may spring a surprise, but the chances are that they won't.

The Army eleven meets Notre Dame at West Point. The western eleven has been greatly strengthened since it was beaten by Yale and there is a real possibility that Notre Dame may duplicate its triumph of last year over the strong Army team.

In the west the Illinois eleven, the big surprise of the year, is the only conference team that has not been tied or beaten. Illinois has mingled in five battles and has been scored on but once. That was by Minnesota last Saturday. Illinois has scored

169 points in five games—a mighty husky average.

The Chicago and Wisconsin teams have not been eaten, but both have been tied. The showing to date of both these elevens has not been as good as that of Illinois. The Wisconsin eleven won from Ohio State 7 to 6 and the Illinois eleven beat Ohio State a week later 34 to 0. Chicago beat Indiana 34 to 0 and Illinois beat Indiana 51 to 0.

So, if you take the comparative showings into consideration, the fact stands out that Illinois is better than either Chicago or Wisconsin. Wisconsin plays Minnesota today and Wisconsin may be beaten and thus eliminated from the fight. Neither Chicago nor Illinois have important games today. They fight it out at Urbana, Ill., a week from today and on the following Saturday Illinois plays Wisconsin. These two battles probably will settle the championship fight in the west.

In the southern part of this land there are five teams that are still in the battle for the honors below the Mason and Dixon line. Those five teams are Washington and Lee, Virginia, Auburn, Mississippi University and Tennessee. However, the Virginia and Washington and Lee teams do not belong to that dear, old southern Intercollegiate Athletic association and so, as they view things in the south, "the claims of either of those teams to the championship cannot be recognized."

Washington and Lee, however, doesn't care much whether its claims will be recognized. It submits its scoring record—the greatest compiled by any team in the country—and lets the public make its own decision. Washington and Lee has scored 288 points in six games. The W. and L. defensive record also is the best, only six points having been scored against the crack eleven.

Tennessee looks to have the best team in the S. I. A. A., but it may strike a snag today when it goes up against the Vanderbilt eleven. Vanderbilt this year hasn't cut many dummies in a football way. Its team was given a beating by North Carolina some weeks back and the Vandy crowd hasn't been able to perform in the style of other years. But it may do a "comeback" against Tennessee.

Summing up the situation, the only sizeable teams in the country that have won every game played are: University of Pittsburg, Army, New York University, Washington and Lee, and Union College, of Schenectady, N. Y.

The list of teams that have not been beaten, but which have been tied, include Harvard, Princeton, Penna State, Wisconsin and Chicago. Washington and Lee, with 288 points scored in six games, has the scoring record to date, Dartmouth and Washington and Jefferson are tied for second honors with 221 points each. The Worcester Polytechnic team of Worcester, Mass., is the only team that has failed to score.
