ESMERALDA WILL NOT OBEY ORDERS OF TAX BOARD

COMMISSION'S AUTHORITY IS FLOUTED AND SUPREME COURT CALLED IN.

CARSON CITY, Dec. 4.—The county commissioners of Esmeralda county, having refused to reduce the tax rate and to increase certain assessed valuations according to the orders of the Nevada Tax Commission, Attorney-General Thatcher has filed a petition with the supreme court praying for a writ of mandamus ordering Esmeralda county to comply with the instructions of the tax commission. The case has been set for today.

The tax commission ordered the increase of certain assessed valuations and also reduced the rate from \$1.55 to \$1.16 on the hundred dollars, which rate on the increased valuation would produce an amount, the commission holds, ample to meet the estimated expenses of the Esmeralda county government. The county board refused to be guided by the recommendations, so the commission has taken the matter before the highest tribunal in the state.

This is the first time the tax commission has gone into court to have its authority sustained and it is expected the action of the court will settle finally the whole question. Several other counties besides Esmeralda have refused to abide by the commission's order.

CALIFORNIA MUST SHOW CAUSE FOR WANTING A MAN

OAKLAND OFFICER WHO CAME AFTER A PRISONER WILL GO BACK EMPTY HANDED.

In the district court this morning Judge Averill heard an application for a writ of habeas corpus in the case of James C. Lessley, who was held on extradition papers issued by the governor of California for alleged failure to provide for the maintenance of his child living in Oakland. The application was made by D. K. and J. K. Chambers and after giving the matter close consideration the court ordered that the case be continued for sixty days to allow the state of California time to offer more evidence.

The attorneys for the defendant raised the question of the validity of the warrant issued by the governor of California which, on the face, did not offer sufficiency of evidence to justify the court in complying with the requisition.

Judge Averill held the objection was well taken, but said the state of California had the right to make a further showing, and for that purpose the determination was postponed sixty days. The court also made an order that Lessley report to the sheriff of Nye county twice a week and, with this understanding, defendant went back to work in the Victor mine.

The state of California was represented by Lou F. Agnew, captain of inspectors of Oakland. Lessley is an old timer in this district, having worked here for eight years, but had been in California within the past two years. He has the reputation of being a deserving and honorable man who has sent a portion of his wages every month to support his child. It was this knowledge that induced Chief of Police Evans to hold Lessley under parole pending arrival of the officer.

GOLDFIELD GOSSIP ABOUT THE MINES

JUMBO EARNINGS FOR NOVEMBER NETTED COMPANY \$100,000.

The gross and net earnings of the Jumbo Extension Mining company in November exceeded those of every other month, not excepting the early boom days of the district. According to a preliminary estimate the gross earnings for the last month amounted to \$125,000 and the net realization to \$100,000, an increase of approximately \$24,000 over October.

The Lone Star will sink a new shaft on the Lazy George fraction

about 800 feet south of the present main shaft on the same claim. The old shaft was put down to a depth of 320 feet, at which depth it revealed the latite-shale contact dipping to the southwest. The new shaft will be three-compartment, and it is the intention to sink to the contact, at a depth of 700 feet.
