

BONANZA CHAMBER IS FULL OF VIRGIN GOLD

CRESSON STRIKE AT CRIPPLE CREEK SAID TO HAVE UP. SET ALL THEORIES.

DENVER, Colo., Dec. 17.—Gold is pouring like water from the Cresson strike at Cripple Creek, according to advices received here today from Cripple Creek.
 Some of the leading gold producers of Colorado have been permitted to inspect the bonanza chamber of the property and the sight of a chamber full of virgin gold, glittering under the dim lamps of the miners, has stunned them.

Manager Smale, of the Portland mine, says that the Cresson ore, struck at 1,200 feet below the surface, upsets all previous theories of the United States geological survey. The experts estimated the value of the ore from \$5,000,000 to \$100,000,000.

The chamber where the gold is being mined with picks, the ore being too soft for blasting, is sealed with a heavy steel door similar to a bank vault and the miners work under guard. There are numerous small cavities in the sylvanite walls, and this golden grain pours in rivulets without being mined.

It is declared that the cave of gold, for such it is, was found to contain large quantities of broken ore, made up of decomposed quartz and pure gold nuggets of large size.

PRECINCT ONE GIVES DUNSEATH A GAIN

PLATT'S PROSPECTS IMPROVE IN SEVERAL RECOUNTS TO DATE.

The recount of precinct 1 of Tonopah in the contest over election for justice of the peace, Harry Dunseath, who on the face of the returns had 179 votes, is now credited with 173, a loss of six. On the other hand, P. J. Gallagher is given 143 votes instead of 150, as returned by the election officers, making a net gain of one vote in the precinct for Dunseath.

The recount is taking place before Judge Peter J. Somers, of Esmeralda county. At a casual glance it appears that Sam Platt is gaining in Tonopah. He has not yet given notice that he will contest the election of Senator Newlands, but it is said he is keeping in close touch with the various county recounts.

BURNED HIS EYE.

A. P. Foley, a machinist in the employ of the Las Vegas & Tonopah road, suffered an intensely painful injury Monday last. In attempting to start a gasoline at Bonnie Clare pumping station, he applied his eye to the ignition hole to observe whether the gas exploded properly. It did.

LEASE OF MIZPAH AND THE PROPOSE CAPITALIZATION

BOTH COMPANIES WILL PROBABLY KEEP NEW STOCK IN TREASURIES.

Charles E. Knox, vice-president of the Mizpah Extension company, spent some time on the property yesterday and is well satisfied with the prospects of that company being taken over by the Tonopah Mining company. He confirms every word of the statement printed in the Bonanza about the terms of the contract between the two companies and feels there is no doubt the stockholders will ratify the action of the board at the meeting on December 28th. From expressions he believes a large majority will favor the deal as reported.

In connection with the lease it is not generally understood that the new issue of capital stock for \$5,000,000 will be held in the treasuries of each company, but it is probable that this will be the case, the Tonopah Mining company holding 60 per cent and the Mizpah Extension 40 per cent without any distribution of this stock at all. Should the lease and bond be ratified the Tonopah Mining company will enter into possession on the first of January.

WITTENBERG MILL STARTS TOMORROW

BIG PINE CO. WILL USE THE GLORY HOLE METHOD OF MINING.

The Wittenberg mill, on the Big Pine property at Manhattan, will start operations tomorrow. The mill has a capacity of 200 tons of ore daily.

The glory hole system of mining is being employed on the Big Pine. The ore is dropped 200 feet and then is hoisted and taken by a belt conveyor to the mill. There is a ledge 60 feet in width on the property and the average value is \$5 a ton. From the 200-foot level of the shaft a drift has been run 500 feet on the ore.

BIG HOIST ARRIVES FOR TONOPAH EXTENSION

A double drum hoist for the Tonopah Extension has arrived and will be installed at the new shaft, known as the No. 2. The machinery weighs 22,000 pounds. It has been loaded, but will not be hauled to the shaft until the roads are in better shape.
