GOOD SERVICE BY WINGED INFANTRY

FRENCH CYCLING CORPS IS BEING AUGMENTED IN NUMBERS

(By Associated Press.) PARIS, Feb. 15.—The winged "infantry" or French cycling corps, has rendered such good service that the contingent is being increased considerably.

Though cycling as a sport continued its hold on France longer than on any other country it was, like the automobile, neglected by the army until August, 1913, when the minister of war authorized its use in conjunction with the cavalry, with the object of increasing the offensive capacity of the latter. War has proven that it has a wider scope of usefulness, being able to replace the cavalry entirely where the ground is favorable, with the added efficiency of the infantry.

Cyclists in the army receive the same training as the infantry, with a special course of instruction in the use of the bicycle in the field. They are trained in the exercise of folding their machines until they are capable of making a halt, shouldering their outfit and transforming themselves into infantry ready to charge in one minute.

One of the oldest cyclists in the service is, no doubt, the veteran Diers who was one of the champions of France 30 years ago. His two sons, Edouard and Eugene, who were also champions in their turn, are cyclist messengers. Honore Fossier, another veteran, and his son Henri, a well known long distance rider, are also carrying dispatches.

GOOD FIND MADE IN JUSTICE MINE

THREE FEET OF \$78.50 ORE EXPOSED ABOVE 265-FOOT LEVEL

In addition to a two-inch streak of picture rock, three feet of ore that assays \$78.50 per ton has been exposed at a height of thirty feet in a new raise above the west drift from the south crosscut on the 265-foot level of that portion of the Daisy property being operated under a two and a half year lease by the Justice Gold Mines company in conjunction with adjoining Gold Coin Extension claim, one of the three claims which it owns, says the Goldfield Tribune. In advancing the raise, the management has extracted fifty tons of ore of an average value of \$50 per ton, which will be shipped in the near future, Manager C. H. Hays states that he expects to make three fifty-ton carload shipments from the property during the present month.

The vein in which the new find has been made was revealed by the south crosscut sixty-four feet from the main Daisy shaft, through which the company is operating.
