**ASHDOWN MINE IS NOW BEING WORKED**

**NINE MEN EMPLOYED AND MILL WILL BE STARTED UP NEXT MONTH**

The old camp of Ashdown, in the extreme northern part of Humboldt county, is again coming to the front and from present indications will be producing gold bullion before very long, says the Silver State. J. M. Lyon, who, with associates, last year acquired the Ashdown property, is spending a few days in town attending to business matters. He stated that he had assumed the management of the property and there are nine men working there at the present time, seven men having been employed all winter.  
 In speaking of the general conditions of the property, Mr. Lyon stated that there is a large tonnage of a good grade milling ore on the dumps and blocked out in the principal workings and that they expect to start up the mill some time next month. Last fall a new engine and other machinery was installed in the mill and the plant is now ready for the reduction of ore. This plant is of the roller type and of twenty tons capacity.  
 The camp of Ashdown is situated about 110 miles northwest of Winnemucca, near the Oregon line, in the Pine Forest range. Some years ago this property was a big producer of the precious yellow metal and Mr. Lyon believes that the rejuvenation there will bring about better results than were accomplished in the past. The property has undergone extensive development and in all the workings there are good showings of ore. Mr. Lyon is sending out today a large team load of supplies, including a big supply of distillate to be used at the property.

**Notice to Mining Corporations**

Foreign corporations doing business in Nevada should heed the fact that their annual statements must be published before April 1. The following law applies to the publication:  
 Section 1. All foreign corporations doing business in the state of Nevada shall, not later than the month of March each year, beginning in the year 1914, publish a statement of their last year's business in some newspaper published in the state of Nevada. If published in a daily newspaper, such statement shall be published for a period of one week, or if published in a semi-weekly or tri-weekly newspaper, for a period of two weeks, or if published in a weekly newspaper for a period of four weeks.  
 Section 2. The secretary of the company publishing the statement shall file a copy with the several assessors of the state of Nevada. Secretaries are urged to send in statements by return mail.
