FINE WAR HOSPITAL IS ZITA KURHAUS

CONSISTS OF 72 WARDS AND EACH IS A SEPARATE BUILDING

(By Associated Press.)
VENICE, April 23.—One of the finest of the new war hospitals which have sprung into being all over Austro-Hungary during the past eight months, is the Zita Kurhaus in Budapest. It consists of 72 wards, each a separate building. The site is a large tract of land on the edge of the city, formerly the property of Bulgarian truck farmers.

The whole enterprise, originally designed to house the incoming flood of Polish refugees, was completed in three weeks, and the Hungarians point with great pride to this accomplishment of their engineering experts. "In peace times," they say, "such a work of construction would have taken at least six months."

In the center of the Kurhaus grounds there are extensive gardens, in which some remarkable tree-planting has been done.

The Kurhaus accommodates over 3400 patients. It has been filled from the start. No untrained nurses are employed, but volunteer workers, many of them women of social prominence in Budapest, are used in the kitchens and offices. The Countess Telecki, for instance, has acquired a considerable reputation for her work at the pastry machines, and one of the most popular pastries in Hungary is now known as the Telecki plum-tart.

ARTISANS ARE NEEDED BY THE BRITISH ARMY

VOLUNTEERS REQUESTED FOR THE PRODUCTION OF WAR'S NECESSARIES

(By Associated Press.)
LONDON, April 23.—A new recruiting poster has made its appearance all over London calling for recruits of "any age, any measurements, any medical qualifications or disqualifications," so long as they are good mechanics or capable of doing any of the work necessary for turning out of war munitions.

Men who volunteer for this service will register their names with the recruiting officers, but they will be employed directly by the armament firms, not by the government. The recruiting officers thus become a sort of labor exchange for the firms which are producing shells, rifles, and other necessities of war.

The new poster is headed "The Man the Army Wants Now," and bears a sketch of an artisan at work.

NEVADA MINING NEWS

W. W. Wells of Jungo, near Winnemucca, will soon begin the marketing of antimony ore.

It is stated that work has been begun in mill installation for the Eastern Star mine in Gold Circle district.

The DemJohn Mining company, operating at Pioche, in the near vicinity of the Prince Consolidated, will probably resume operations at an early day.

The Rex mill, at Midas, Gold Circle district, is in regular commission and is treating ores from the Rex and Colorado Grande mines. The ore being treated goes about \$15 to the ton, with a mining and milling cost of about \$8 per ton.

The Long Hike Mining company of Elko, L. G. Clark, president, operating in the Jarbidge district, is feeling jubilant over reports of an important strike recently made in its property, consisting of three feet of ore assaying over \$300 to the ton. This property adjoins the Flaxie group.

The Rockland Milling company, of Rockland, E. J. Schrader, general manager, has resumed work in the operation of its mines and is preparing to start up its new 100-ton plant. The company, it is stated, has 70,000 tons of milling ore blocked out in its mine workings. Electric power is employed. Rockland is located 25 miles south of Yerington.

The Nevada Consolidated Company, of Ely, has decided to resume work in the operation of its Ruth mine. The caving system will be utilized in mining and it is expected the output will be both large and regular within the next two months. Underground development will be in charge of William Spencer, assisted by William Caulfield, both of whom were with the Utah Copper company at Bingham, Utah.

The Prince Consolidated Mining company of Pioche produced 15,385 tons of ore during March, and is shipping from 80 to 90 carloads each week. The company is giving employment to a force of 110 men. The company recently sent out its annual report which shows available resources of \$119,650 in cash, and \$16,796 in notes and accounts receivable. It is expected the Prince will be in the dividend-paying column in the near future.
