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**WINTER ROUTE THROUGH TONOPAH**

WE NOTE that Tonopah is more or less excited about getting a branch Midland trail through the silver camp. Tonopah is right in its claim that the transcontinental auto traffic is worth bidding for. It was in furtherance of this project that the town turned out in full strength the other day, and, in collaboration with Goldfield motorists and good roads enthusiasts, put the Tonopah-Goldfield auto road in good shape. Now there chances to be another opportunity along this line that Tonopah overlooks—that is the winter traffic. There is one good route from Tonopah to the coast in midwinter—and it doesn't pass by Independence. Practically all of the year the southern route is practicable for touring and the southern route should run through Esmeralda and Nye, through the Amargosa valley and Carrara, by way of Vegas and then on over the Vegas coast road, on which many improvements have been made during the present season by public spirited autoists of Clark county. Among the improvements is a \$13,000 bridge over the river, incidentally, says the Carrara Obelisk.

This route seems to be the only logical winter trail. Last year several parties came through lower Death valley, by way of Silver Lake, Zabriskie and Death Valley Junction, but not a party came through without much trouble, and three parties walked out of the valley, in the neighborhood of the Buttes on the Salt Basin road. A hundred per cent. batting average of troubles will discourage the average motorist—and if it doesn't, it should. On the short cut from Silver Lake, or Avawatz, to Zabriskie, there is one seven-mile stretch from the Salt Basin road to the Beaumont freight road, without a vestige of a trail, the motorist must drive across seven miles of trailless up grade, divided between rocky stretches and heavy sands. The road running through the valley over the old Confidence mill is not marked and is very difficult to negotiate without getting lost in the road mazes around Avawatz. If Tonopah will, in connection with her tourist ambitions, remember that the southern route is open the year through, and do some incidental advertising for the rest of the county, we will be truly grateful. Of course some little real road work might be done in connection with this, but that is up to the county commissioners.

**THE OUTLOOK FOR SILVER**

THE European war has had a most beneficial effect upon the prices of all metals except silver and lead, but certainly these metals will soon be in far greater demand than at the present time. The nations at war, and also those that are attempting to maintain neutrality, are being plunged headlong into an indebtedness which staggers the reasoning power of the most famous financiers. While the nations are maintaining large reserves of metal money in their treasuries, they are, as a matter of fact, conducting their operations largely upon a paper basis, which issues must later be provided for by the issuing of bonds payable in coin. If the war lasts another year the indebtedness of the European nations will amount to four times more than all the real money in the world, the interest upon which will be so great that they cannot hope to begin paying anything upon the principal for several generations. In the meantime the United States will have absorbed the principal portion of the gold of the world, hence when the war is over it will be necessary for the nations of Europe to refinance themselves. In order to meet their obligations in coin they will be compelled to adopt the double standard of currency. This appears to be inevitable, because their gold reserves will have disappeared in part and their countries will have become swamped with a constantly depreciating currency. Silver as a money metal will then come into its own, and will be due for a steady advance in price, which will be beneficial to all sections where the metal is produced.—Ely Record.

## SLIMES TREATED BY IMPROVED METHOD

NEW PROCESS WILL BE USED IN MILL TO BE BUILT NEAR ROCHESTER

A new process for extracting values from ore that has already undergone preliminary treatment has been patented by the California Extraction company of San Francisco. Two representatives of the company arrived in Tonopah Tuesday morning. They are A. E. Vandercook, engineer, and H. C. Lyon, the Nevada agent. Mr. Lyon is well known here, he having covered this field for years in the powder business.

The plant the company installs has made several successful tests of Montana-Tonopah ore, getting 93.8 per cent extraction in 17 hours. This was done with the use of only a pound of cyanide to the ton. The process is all-sliming, amalgamation and cyanidation. The primary processes are the same as in other plants, the new system hooking on to the tube mills. In it are used classifiers, amalgamators, thickeners and combination agitator filters. By this process there is no heating of the solutions nor use of lead salts. Only three tanks are used in the system, which lowers the cost, while there is a saving of time as it is a cycle instead of a recurrent method. A 50-ton unit was recently in-

stalled at the A. B. C. mine in Yuba county, California, and is working very successfully. A 75-ton plant will be erected at the Nevada Packard mine in Rochester district. This ore carries a preponderance of silver values, but even at that the trial runs required only two pounds of cyanide to the ton. The extraction was better than 90 per cent.


**SOUTHERN NEVADA ROAD TO THE YOSEMITE PARK**
