CITIZENS ARRANGE TO GIVE CHRISTMAS TREE

THE SAME COMMITTEE WILL ALSO BE CONTINUED FOR WORK OF CHARITY

A committee of citizens, formed for a dual purpose, the providing of a public Christmas tree for the children of Tonopah and for the relief of distress throughout the winter, was held at 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon in the club room at the Mizpah hotel.

The meeting was presided over by Permanent Chairman W. B. Evans and by Paul Revert, chairman of the executive committee, the latter having the chair in view of the fact that, while the meeting was semi-public, it was under the auspices of the executive committee.

The Bonanza's offer to provide all publicity free was well received. The members of the finance committee of the Fourth of July celebration will be interviewed and their authority requested so that Treasurer Wittenberg may be authorized to make good his offer to assign over to this committee all or part of the money that remains after the celebration and it is a very substantial nest egg.

It was planned, on the suggestion of Chief Evans, that from \$400 to \$500 be expended for the Christmas tree. Chairman Revert repeated his liberal offer on the part of the Verdi Lumber company to furnish a tree free and also to tender the use of the Airdome without cost. There was

some talk of having the Christmas tree in the open air, but the vagaries of the weather were considered and the offer of Mr. Revert was accepted with enthusiasm.

Mrs. Nutto was made chairman of the committee to discover worthy indigents who might be helped. A committee on contributions and collection of clothing was appointed. It was decided that all donations should be sent to the office of the chief of police or notification made by telephone and on a certain day, yet to be fixed, a collector will visit the donors.

Mr. Revert was made chairman of the tree committee. Bud Morris was made chairman of the committee on music. Mr. McDonald was appointed chairman of the decoration and lighting committee for the Christmas tree. Mrs. Hunt will have charge of the literary exercises on that occasion. Chief Evans was appointed chairman of the Santa Claus committee. Sheriff Slavin will head the committee for the purchase of gifts. Mrs. Swasey was made a committee to arrange for the fixing up of bags to contain the presents. Prof. George L. Dilworth was selected to head the publicity committee. The meeting then adjourned until next Sunday at 2 o'clock at the same place.
