NEVADA IS HOME OF THE PURE OPAL

In the extreme northwest corner of Humboldt county, Nevada, is a deposit of precious opal, which in point of area and variety of product as well as quality of the gem material, probably exceeds any similar deposit known. Opals have been found from time to time during the last twenty years by stockmen, who ranged their herds between the Black Rock desert and the California line, but the first real gemstones were found by "Deb" Rupp in 1912 on Virgin creek, a branch of Thousand creek, about 30 miles south west of Denio and fully twenty miles south of the Nevada-Oregon line. Rupp's property is about the center of the gem-bearing area as it is known that gems occur in the same strata from Soldier Meadows to the Oregon line, a distance of over 40 miles.

WANTED!—A STATION

Within the last week, three carloads of freight have been received at Carrara. The week previous, one came in. From shipping bills, at least three more should arrive in the next week, says the Obelisk. The carload shipments that have been coming in during the current year, together with the regular business done at the Carrara station would seem to entitle the marble camp to a regular station and agent. It is certain that freight customers of the road would be pleased to have a station established as, at present, the handling of freight shipments leaves something to be desired.

SCARLET FEVER IS CHECKED AT RENO

According to reports from the office of the city health officer, Dr. Samuels, the cases of scarlet fever which have been causing considerable alarm here, have been effectually checked. But three new cases have been reported during the week and the four weeks' quarantine which has been enforced by the city was lifted yesterday from four homes and a number of other cases are about ready to be released from quarantine.—Reno Journal.

ALL DEPARTMENTS RUNNING

C. & O. had set out to be transferred to the W. P. line at the crossing at Hackstaff. The W. P. train did not stop for the crossing nor did it whistle.

BULLET ENDS HIS LIFE

The dead body of George Abbott, a brakeman on the Southern Pacific, working at Reno, was found in his room at a hotel in the northern city by the night clerk. He was in good

condition financially, but was injured recently and was dependent, according to those who knew him. He was a member of the Tonopah lodge of the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen and was about 45 years of age. He shot himself with a revolver.
