HEAVY FIGHTING IN SOUTHWEST SERBIA

Battle Between Bulgarians and French-British Troops is Impending

LONDON, Dec. 8.—With the Serbians retreating behind the Albanian and Montenegrin frontier it is reported that the bulk of the German and Bulgarian armies is being concentrated against the allied armies, which are holding the southwest corner of Serbia.

HUNGARIAN DIPLOMAT IN FAVOR OF PEACE

AMSTERDAM, Dec. 8.—A speech by Julius Andrássy, ex-premier of Hungary, in the chamber, dealt with the possibility of peace, according to a dispatch. He said, "It is a humane duty to make peace at the earliest possible moment. I am completely convinced that we shall be able to conquer despite the most extreme resistance of our enemies and continue the war until our adversaries are forced to ask for peace, but it would be a blessing if it is possible to conclude peace before this last moment comes."

MONTENEGRO DESIRES SEPARATE PEACE

BERLIN, Dec. 8.—The Overseas news agency says: Montenegro has expressed a desire for separate peace. King Nicholas, according to dispatches, has personally handed to the entente ambassadors a document suggesting the possibility of a separate peace, as Montenegro is unable to withstand the superior forces of the enemy.

VICTORIOUS END IS GERMANY'S RESOLVE

BERLIN, Dec. 8.—At a caucus of the free conservative members of the Reichstag, resolutions were adopted "demanding as an object of peace, a Germany strengthened in its position of power, importantly enlarged, and recompensed for expenditures through retention of the uttermost extent possible of all districts now occupied."

MAMMOTH LINER IS BEING TOWED TO PORT

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 8.—The disabled Hill liner Minnesota, bound from Seattle for Europe, with a cargo worth \$1,000,000, has been taken in tow and is proceeding to San Francisco, according to a wireless message. The wrecking steamer Inaqua, and the tug Dauntless reached the Minnesota yesterday, 700 miles south of here.
