VIRGIN PLAYERS, BUT REALLY NOT DAMSELS

BUNKERVILLE TEAM IS COMING TO PUT TONOPAH ON THE MAP

A confirmation of the telegram recently sent by Bunkerville was received yesterday by Wm. Cuddy stating that the Virgin high school squad of Bunkerville would play the Tonopah city team in this city on March 30th.

The game on the 30th will be for the unlimited championship, as the Bunkerville team has already won the high school laurels of this section and Tonopah the unlimited. The local squad has been putting in some hard kicks the past few evenings and judging from the game put up by the fast Virgin highs they will need all the speed and skill that they can muster.

This game will undoubtedly be the "game de luxe" of the season as the city team has a very good team for a camp of this size and the Virgin high one of the best teams that the locals ever had the opportunity to compete with.

The betting is at a ratio of two to one, in favor of Bunkerville, but the local squad are confident that this lead will be cut down by the night of the game as they have the best line-up they have ever had, as it includes Richard Sheehy, a veteran of the University of Nevada, where he played on the regulars for three years and was named for the "all coast" team twice during this period.
