The hope held out for the safety of the four men below the 1,400 level of the Belcher vanished yesterday morning when the body of Thomas McDonald was found a short distance below the 1,400 level and later the bodies of Felice Casale, Ermano Battaglia and D. Olinto were found, says the Virginia City Enterprise.

McDonald was employed as pump man below the 1,600 and had struck up 200 feet of the incline and perished almost in sight of what would have been safety. He was trapped by the flames from the 1,400 connecting drift as his head and shoulders were badly burned and part of his forehead blackened.

POLITICAL FORECAST BY LETSON BALLIET

NATIONAL SITUATION AFTER VISITING 21 STATES

Letson Balliet, manager of the Buckeye properties writes the Bonanza as follows:

TREBLING THE FORCE AT THE ALUM MINE

NEVADA CHEMICAL COMPANY INCREASES EMPLOYEES AT BLAIR PROPERTY

D. H. Walker, superintendent for the Nevada Chemical company, which consists of Victor Barndt and associates, has sent several samples of the material which is being mined from the property under lease several miles north of Blair to the National museum, formerly the Smithsonian, at Washington. One of the specimens, kalamite, crystallized potash, is considered very rare. It is now registered in the museum as exhibit No. 57,811.

Mr. Walker is now crosscutting on the 83 foot level from the No. 6 shaft. His force has recently been trebled. Seven hundred and fifty feet north-east of the No. 6 shaft work has been begun on a surface showing of sulphur twenty feet in width.

ELECTRIC LOCOMOTIVES MADE IN TONOPAH

Campbell & Kelly, the firm that was "tried in the fire," is developing a new line, that of manufacture of electric locomotives for use underground. The first locomotive is being tried out and is proving a great success in the Tonopah Extension on the level at the bottom of the new vertical shaft.

It is operated by trolley power, the motor being one-phase, using a direct current. This locomotive will be shipped to the Nevada Wonder. It is 18-inch gauge and is 7 1/2 horse-power. It hauls ten one-ton cars at the rate of six miles an hour.


