

# JAPANESE TENNIS CHAMPION COMES TO THE PACIFIC COAST

(By Associated Press.)  
 DEL MONTE, Cal., June 19.—The anticipated appearance of G. Kumagai of Japan, tennis champion of the Orient, has added a decided international interest to the twenty-ninth annual Pacific coast tennis tournament which opens here tomorrow and closes Saturday, June 25. The young Japanese has been known to American tennis enthusiasts by reputation for some time. He first won prominence by forcing Ella Fottrell of San Francisco to a hard-fought five set match in 1912, in the final for the Oriental championship.

This winter the Japanese sprang into the limelight of international tennis by defeating Clarence Griffin, American national doubles champion, twice decisively in the Orient. He will make his first appearance in the United States on the courts here and naturally his advent has been awaited with considerable interest. William H. Johnson, present national champion, is starting his season at the same time and a possible clash of the champions of Asia and America is looked forward to with eager interest.

Last year the Pacific coast title was won by Herbert Hahn of Stanford University, the first comparatively unknown player to hold the important western honor for many years. Johnson was defeated by Vandyke Johns of Stanford. Then Hahn disposed of his college mate. Hahn is returning from an eastern tour where he went to defend his title.

The east will have a decided interest in the tournament because of the presence of Miss Clare Cassel of New York. Some objection to her playing in the tournament as an amateur while appearing professionally as

an ice skater in San Francisco was raised, but the protest was ignored by the officials. She has won, among other titles, the national indoor doubles, the New York and New Jersey championships.

Regulations governing the junior division have been modified to conform to the rules of the national body. Formerly competitors had to be under nineteen years of age and were ineligible if they had taken part in an open event. Now the age limit is 20 years and the question of previous tournaments does not figure. Roland Roberts, a 19-year-old product of the San Francisco parks and trained under the watchful eye of S. R. Marvin, who coached McLaughlin, is the favorite for this event. If he wins he will undoubtedly be sent to New York to participate in the national junior championships.

A year ago Mrs. George Wightman (Miss Hazel Hotchkiss) of Los Angeles won the women's title after Miss Anita Meyers, a San Francisco girl, startled the tennis world by disposing of Miss Molla Fjurstedt, the present national woman champion. Mrs. Wightman is not competing this year, but Miss Meyers, Mrs. H. A. Neimeyer, Miss Helen Baker, and all the leading women players of northern California will be present. Mrs. May Sutton is said to be an uncertainty, but her sister, Miss Florence Sutton of Los Angeles is expected to play.

Ward Dawson and Allan Barber of Los Angeles are certain in the men's singles. McLaughlin and John Strachan are not expected to be present this year. Between twenty and thirty of the leading players of San Francisco and Oakland have entered. The entries closed June 15.

## MEDAL OF GRATITUDE GIVEN TO FOREIGNERS

### PRESIDENT POINCARÉ URGED TO RECOGNIZE SERVICES OF VOLUNTEERS

 PARIS, May 19.—M. Briand, president of the cabinet and minister of foreign affairs, has presented a report to President Poincaré proposing the creation of a "medal of gratitude," in recognition of services rendered voluntarily to France by subjects of foreign countries during the war. The distinction will comprise three classes and the medal will be vermeil for the first, silver for the second, and bronze for the third. On one side will be engraved in French "French Gratitude," and persons on whom the distinction is conferred will be given a diploma recalling the services that the medal commemorates.

## Political Mathematical Analyses

Letson Balliet, political analyst, ventures some daring figures on the result of the next election in Nevada in the following analysis, which, in view of the coming election, will be interesting:

For U. S. Senator

Newlands, Democrat	8,078
Platt, Republican	8,038
Miller, Socialist	5,451

For Congressman

Roberts, Republican	8,915
Fowler, Democrat	8,631
Scanlan, Socialist	4,294

For Mine Inspector

Stinson, Republican	9,944
Ryan, Democrat	7,014
Richie, Socialist	4,992

It will be interesting to notice that, although Newlands was elected, he had but 40 votes more than Platt, and in that case Miller, the Socialist, ran about 1,200 votes ahead of the Socialist opponents of the other officers, where the Republicans were elected.

Another interesting point is to note that Stinson, Currier, Abel, Eggers, Kyle, Roberts, McMillan, Holmes and Oddie, who, with the exception of Stinson and Roberts, were defeated, all ran from 500 to 1,900 votes ahead of Senator Newlands. Miller ran

1,200 votes ahead of the Socialist ticket.

Considering the whole ticket, with similar comparisons throughout, we find that there were about 21,500 votes cast at the last election. This being presidential year we can expect the normal male vote to be about 22,500. To this must be added the unknown quantity of female votes that will appear in the final count. On account of the timidity of the gentler sex in entering into politics, the best we can do is to estimate it and for this analysis we will assume it to be slightly less than half the male vote.

Under the existing circumstances the presidential candidates can be figured:


Hughes over 15,000 male votes	Wilson under 7,500 male votes
