BUREAU OF GOLD MINING

CHINA is taking the first steps to place that nation on the single standard, using the yellow metal as the basis for values. This is the first step of the new administration to place the nation on a footing with the western rivals and also to foil the movement of its commercial rival, Japan, which has been steadily accumulating gold for the past eight years.

The decision of China to develop its own gold resources will be of material assistance in stabilizing the silver market which will demand the adoption of the white metal as a standard for subsidiary currency and the relegation of minor tokens of base metals from circulation except for fractional payments.

DEMANDS OF RAILWAY EMPLOYEES

THE vote of the several organizations representing the employees of the leading railroads of the country engaged in the active operations of trains is nearly all in, with the conclusion that, unless something unforeseen happens, the country will be plunged into disorder such as has not been witnessed since the last and impotent effort of the American Railway union to secure concessions from the employing companies.

FAKE PUBLICITY SCHEMES

OGDEN, UTAH, has discovered a way of weeding out the publicity pests from outside who periodically visit that town and milt the merchants of funds that should properly go into local advertising circles. This is the result of a campaign inaugurated by the Ogden Publicity bureau, which is prepared to greet all promoters of questionable advertising projects with a cold and unfriendly stare.

According to the method decided upon by the Ogden publicity secretary, every merchant will be supplied with cards for use when he is approached by the solicitor for questionable advertising.
