railway employees was reached because the subcommittee here is without power to reach important decisions without reference to the men in New York.

Thus far the president has not attempted to bring the two sides together on any concrete blanket proposals. He is sounding sentiment on all phases of the situation in order to have the case fully in hand before making a final effort to settle the problems.

For a time yesterday there was pronounced pessimism among administration officials because of the complete failure of effort to bring about an agreement on any form of arbitration. Suggestion on investigation by a commission then was brought forward and its reception aroused new hope that a satisfactory solution might be found.

Both sides continued reticent regarding the discussion. The railroad managers decline absolutely to talk of the negotiations and about all the
