

# ARCTIC VOYAGERS SAY HEAT INTENSE THIS YEAR

(By Associated Press.)  
STOCKHOLM, August 29.—Travelers returning from the north this summer are complaining of the intense heat prevailing at the southern edge of the Arctic circle.

Travelers to Russia who have had to make the journey by rail all the way around the Gulf of Bothnia, say they have suffered intensely from the heat while on the northern reaches of their four days' trip.

At Haparanda, where passengers transfer from Sweden to Finland, the temperatures this summer have ranged from 10 to 20 degrees warmer

than here in Stockholm, several hundred miles to the south. This difference if of course attributed to the longer hours of sunshine prevailing in the north, Haparanda being but a short distance from the zone of midnight sun.

In company with the rest of Europe, Sweden turned up the clock one hour this summer, although "daylight saving" was hardly a necessity in this land of long twilights and white nights. Daylight football games have been played this summer beginning at 8:20 p. m., and eighteen holes of golf have been possible after a 7 o'clock dinner.

# OPENING DARDANELLES BREAKS WHEAT PRICES

(By Associated Press.)  
CHICAGO, August 29.—The abrupt widening of the European war zone sent wheat values tumbling almost as if the market had no bottom. The extreme fall in prices was 1 1/4c, an amount virtually a parallel to the extraordinary rise witnessed two years ago on the day that hostilities began. Transactions were on a huge scale.

It was the view that the end of the war had perhaps been greatly hastened, which, in the main, brought about the big drop in quotations. When the most conservative traders

seriously discussed the chance that by a speedy opening of the Dardanelles vast stores of Russian grain would soon reach western Europe as a result of Rumania having at last joined fortunes with the Anglo-French allies. Word late in the session that actual fighting had already commenced on the Rumanian frontier set the wheat pit here nearly frantic, and was followed by a wild close at the lowest prices of the day, \$1.49 1/2 to \$1.49 for September and \$1.43 1/2 to \$1.44 for December, as against Saturday's finish of respectively \$1.51 1/2 and \$1.53 1/2 to \$1.54.

# FIRST EFFECT OF RUMANIA'S ACTION IS FELT IN SUPPLIES

(By Associated Press.)  
PETROGRAD, August 29.—Rumania's declaration of war against Austria is regarded in official circles as of far reaching significance. The Foreign office points out three striking benefits—the aid of the substantial Rumanian army, which, pitted against Austria, will afford greater freedom of action on the Russian left wing on the western front; the tightening of the ring around the central empires and the opening of a new

line of attack; the cutting off of grain supplies to the Austro-Germans, upon which the latter are believed to have placed local reliance.

It is estimated that the effective strength of the army which can be mobilized by Rumania is about 900,000 men, including 10 regiments of Red Hussars and 10 of Black Hussars with artillery aggregating 480 75 millimeter guns, 160 field guns belonging to the reserve, and a number of heavy guns.
