

# GREATEST NEEDS OF NEVADA TODAY

What does Nevada need most? The Bonanza asked last evening of John M. Fulton, assistant general freight and passenger agent for the Southern Pacific company. He replied right off the bat:

"What we must encourage above all other things in the state at present are mining and livestock raising. We cannot utilize more than five per cent of our acreage for agricultural purposes, unless there be a change in the seasons back to the conditions which prevailed centuries ago, when the valleys were waving meadows and the hills were timbered, as shown by the petrifications scattered all over the state. Thus it will be seen that the greater portion of the state must be devoted to grazing purposes.

"We have for many years watched the University of Nevada and the United States agricultural experts to see if there wasn't some place on earth where some seed could be obtained that could be scattered broadcast on the ranges and grow and reseed itself, producing more range food. Today in Nevada it requires ten acres of range land to support one animal, and owing to poor range conditions in Nevada at present and the scarcity of hay, there will be shipped to California for winter feeding not less than 40,000 head of cattle and 250,000 head of sheep.

"We have but twelve inches of rainfall in the most favored portions of the state. Our university and the United States experimentalists might aid materially by experimenting with the cow pea, alfalfa or other forage

plants, and I understand they are giving the matter study and attention.

"Mining is going ahead by leaps and bounds. Two big tungsten properties are operating between Lovelock and Reno and are working between 300 and 400 men. Battle Mountain, Luning and Palisade are shipping thousands of tons of high grade copper ore, which is giving the state great profit. I do not mention other districts, because these are the only ones I have recently visited. There are, I am reliably informed, 3500 more miners at work in the state at present than there were two years ago. Every region is being developed and I am pleased to note that Tonopah continues to be established upon such a firm foundation with the assurances of the future absolute.

"The Thompson smelter has not been running for several years past for the simple reason that there is not sufficient ore being produced to fully supply the plant. Prior to the closing of the smelter the Mason Valley Mine company was buying large quantities of ore from the Ludwig mine, which was owned by the same interests as the Copper Belt railroad. This company concluded to put up a leaching plant and treat its own ore. Without the Ludwig output the smelter could not operate at a profit and closed down. We are advised that there is a reasonably fair prospect for the smelter starting soon, it depending on whether the Bluestone mine can be purchased from Captain DeLaMar.

## PUBLICITY BUREAU IS URGED IN RESOLUTION

(By Associated Press.) ST. LOUIS, Oct. 19.—Establishment of a permanent church publicity bureau because of the increasing dependency of the church upon the press, was urged in a resolution adopted by the house of deputies of the Protestant Episcopal church convention here yesterday. To become effective the resolution must be approved by the house of bishops.

The bureau, according to the plan announced, is to study means of getting the co-operation of the newspapers of the country in carrying on the work of the churches. In presenting the resolution together with the report of the joint committee on press and publicity, Francis L. Stetson of New York asserted that the church is under the greatest obligation to the press.



## WOMEN DENIED EQUAL RIGHTS

(By Associated Press.)

ST. LOUIS, Oct. 19.—Women were denied equal rights with men in two actions taken yesterday by the house of bishops of the Protestant Episcopal general convention in session here. A proposal to permit women to sit as delegates in the general convention was rejected, while a request from the Right Rev. Logan H. Root, bishop of Hankow, to be allowed to permit women to membership in his advisory council, was denied. The house suggested to the bishop of Hankow, it was stated, that he might create an auxiliary council of women.

The proposal to give women equal rights with men in the convention was sponsored by Robert H. Gardner of Maine. A similar resolution is now on the calendar of the house of deputies, and it was pointed out the action in the upper house does not preclude its being discussed in the lower body. Since concurrence of the two houses is necessary in the event the house of deputies should approve the proposal it will go to the house of bishops for recommendation.
