

RUSSIA UNITED ON CARRYING ON WAR

(By Associated Press.)
PETROGRAD, Mar. 19.—With the cementing of the elements concerned in the constitution of the new government on the ruins of the old, the new cabinet members have assumed the posts to which they were assigned. Professor Paul N. Milukoff yesterday received at the foreign office the representatives of entente allies, after which he entered upon a long cabinet conference. One of the first acts of the minister was to notify Russian diplomats abroad that Russia was united in the desire to fight out the war with the allies, the determination to continue the conflict until victory is achieved being stronger than ever.

The armies in the field have advised that the abdication of the emperor has been enthusiastically acquiesced in according to a foreign office official. Telegrams from virtually all the commanders have been received assuring their support, guaranteed in by General Michael Alexeff, chief of staff.

The national colors with their eagles have given place to plain red flags, one of which floats over the famous Winter Palace.

The proper designation of the new government appears to puzzle even officials. "Government constituent" is the appellation used in foreign office dispatches sent abroad. While of a temporary nature, it is permanent compared with the first duma committee, in the opinion of one official, although it is contemplated that the cabinet heads shall govern only until those elected by a constitutional assembly shall replace them. The assembly comprising 600 members to be selected by popular vote will determine the form of the future and draft a new constitution.

Confidence is everywhere expressed that under the new government the country will be enabled to carry on operations upon a much larger scale than before and considerably magnify the effort toward a speedy termination of the war. Endless friction between departments and the continual fear of the old government that took complete organization might result in the sudden growth of popular power have left a great part of the resources of the country inert and useless.

U BOATS NEAR MILLION MARK

WIDE DISPARITY IN THE FIGURES OF LOSSES COMPUTED BY EACH SIDE

BERLIN, Friday, Mar. 19.—Merchant ships of an aggregate gross tonnage of 781,500 were destroyed in February, as a result of war measures of the central powers, the admiralty announced today.

The statement follows:
 In February 265 merchant ships of an aggregate gross tonnage of 781,500 were lost by the war measures of the central powers. Among them were 292 hostile ships, with an aggregate gross tonnage of 644,000 and 74 neutral ships of an aggregate gross tonnage of 137,500. Among the neutral ships, 61 were sunk by submarines, which is 16.5 per cent of the total in February, as compared with 29 per cent, the average of neutral losses in the last four months.

There is a wide disparity between the official German figures of the destruction of shipping in February, the first month of unrestricted submarine warfare and the figures given out in England. It was said authoritatively in London on March 3 that in February German submarines sent to the bottom in round numbers, 490,000 tons of shipping. No mention was made of the ships destroyed by mines.

BRITISH GAIN TEN MILES OF FRONT

(By Associated Press.)
 Important advances over a front of about a hundred miles by the British and French armies in France and additional gains by the Russians and British over the Turks in Turkish Armenia, Persia and Mesopotamia, are the outstanding features in the war news.

The important towns of Peronne, Chaulnes and Neale and more than 50 villages have been taken by the British troops on a front of some 45 miles and King George's men are continuing their pursuit of the retreating Germans. At some points Sunday incursions into German positions were to a depth of ten miles. The operations were carried out on a front of running from Arras to Chaulnes.

Taking up the operations south of Chaulnes, the French troops recaptured their old positions on the Roye-Noyon road, and including the important town of Noyon, in this region, northeast of Lassigny, the French have penetrated more than 12 miles through the German positions toward the town of Ham. To the southeast the entire first line of Germans, including the villages of Carlepoint, Morsam and Nouvrou Vinagre, were captured by the French, while northeast of Solissons Grouy has been taken.

The armies of the Russian Grand Duke Nicholas are pushing the Turks in the Lake Van and Sivas regions in Turkish Armenia and in Persia, in operations which seek to cut off the Turks who are being pressed northward by the British in Mesopotamia, unofficial reports say the town of Van, on the east bank of Lake Van, has been captured by the Russians and that further gains have been made by them in the region of Kermanshah, where the Turkish column is reported in retreat. In Mesopotamia the Ottoman forces are in full flight towards Samarra, north of Bagdad, according to the British war office.

Several engagements of more or less violence have taken place on the front in Russia, but no important changes in terrain have occurred.

In Macedonia strong attacks by the French between Lakes Orhidra and Presha have been repulsed, according to Berlin and attempts by the entente troops to gain an advantage north of Monastir also failed.

Austrian attacks which met with failure are reported at several points along the Austro-Italian front by the Italian war office.

It is unofficially reported that the entire Russian Baltic fleet and the fortresses at Sveaborg and Viborg have gone over to the new Russian government.

NO FREE SEEDS THIS SPRING

Since the home-gardening movement began throughout the country as a means to meet the increased cost of food, the department of agriculture has been swamped with hundreds of thousands of requests for free seeds.

Officials of the department say that unfortunately they have no seeds to distribute. The seeds provided by congress are distributed by members of congress themselves direct, and this year's supply, valued at about \$200,000, was long ago exhausted. No more free seeds will be available until late in the summer.

GERMANS SHELL BRITAIN

CHINA ENTERS WAR WITH THE ENTENTE

SUSPENSION OF BOXER INDEMNITY ONE OF THE TERMS OF AGREEMENT

PEKING, Mar. 19.—After announcing the severance of diplomatic relations between China and Germany, Foreign Minister Wu Ting Fang, called a meeting of the ministers of the entente nations and later a meeting of the ministers of the neutral countries. He presented a memorandum at both meetings, requesting suspension of payments of indemnity for the Boxer uprising, consented to an increase of import duties and modification of China's undertakings that will permit her to station troops at Tien Tsin, along the Tien-Tsin-Peking railroad and in the legation quarter as a protection against Germans.

The Dutch legation is protecting German interests and guarding the German legation. The German minister and his staff probably will leave Peking for Shanghai within five days.

Denmark is looking after Chinese interests in Germany.

In the light of previous dispatches from Peking, the action taken by the Chinese foreign minister indicates that the government is prepar-
