SENSATIONAL MURDER AVENGED BY POSSE

(By Associated Press.) BIRMINGHAM, Ala., Mar. 21.—David D. Overton, the former county court clerk under death sentence for the murder of Judge W. T. Lawlor, was shot to death in a Birmingham suburb by a sheriff's posse sent out to capture him and six other prisoners who had escaped from the county jail early in the day. In the battle between the posse and the prisoners Tony Malino, another convicted murderer also was killed, and J. L. Latham, held on a forgery charge, was seriously wounded. The other convicts escaped.
