POTASH DELIVERY INCREASING FROM A NUMBER OF SOURCES

The output of all potash materials produced and marketed in the United States in 1917, as reported by the manufacturers to the United States Geological Survey, Department of the Interior, was 126,577 short tons, which contained 32,366 short tons, or an average of 26.4 per cent, of pure potash (K2O).

In the following preliminary summary by Mr. Gale the production in 1917 is classified with as much detail as is consistent with the survey's obligation to hold individual reports of production confidential.

Output From Brines. The output of one of the four plants producing potash from brines in western Nebraska considerably exceeded that from any other source or district.

Potash and Kelp and Alunite. The potash produced from kelp represents about 10 per cent of the total. A large part of this was high-grade potassium chloride produced by two companies and the rest was divided among eight other producers.

COAL ORDERS SLOW IN BEING FILLED The big mining companies are availing themselves of the privilege of putting in their winter stocks of coal wherever that fuel is used but the domestic consumer does not appear to pay any attention to the urging of the fuel commissioner. The West End has stored a carload and the school trustees have also taken time by the forelock. All of this coal comes from Utah but, even at this time without the pressure of moving crops or live stock, shippers find difficulty in securing cars. The Wittenberg company is promised 200 tons to be delivered within the next two weeks, but delivery is not guaranteed. The car famine is so acute that it is obvious that those who wait for the coming of cold weather will take a great risk as it is believed that after October fuel deliveries will be few and far between.
