FLOYD WOOD KILLED IN ACTION LAST MONTH

Floyd Wood, only son of Mrs. Nettie E. Wood, a prominent and wealthy widow of San Francisco, and nephew of Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Humphrey of Goldfield, who was killed in action June 19th, left San Francisco in October and was in France the last of December.

Four years ago Floyd held a clerical position in Tonopah. Later he was manager of the well-known Pine Creek ranch of Monitor valley. While there he was seriously injured and remained a patient in the Tonopah Miners Union hospital for over three months.

From that time he spent practically two years in San Francisco trying to regain his health, which for many years had been very poor.

He was a brilliant lad of splendid abilities and possessed the shrewd adaptability of the Humphrey family of Nevada, a personality which made him a universal favorite with all.

SODA PLANT AT KEELER BURNED TO GROUND

Fire completely destroyed the \$300,000 plant at Keeler of the Natural Soda Products company Sunday afternoon. The blaze was discovered at noon but it had already gained such headway in the warehouse, where it originated, that the 150 employees could not check it and the entire plant was leveled to the ground in three hours.
