ENEMY U-BOATS BUSY OFF CAPE COD

WASHINGTON, July 22.—An enemy submarine was reported Saturday off the Massachusetts coast. The Orleans naval station at Cape Cod reported sighting a tug and three barges burning after being shelled by a submarine. Warships are searching.

SIBERIAN RULER PROVES TRACTABLE

LONDON, July 22.—General Horvath, recently proclaimed provisional ruler of Siberia, says a dispatch from Harbin, has assured the allied ministers at Pekin that he wishes an understanding with the Czech ministers who had feared he intended to prevent westward progress of the Czech-Slovaks.

MOONEY'S FATE UP TO GOVERNOR

SUPREME COURT AFFIRMS ITS ORDERS DENYING A NEW TRIAL

SAN FRANCISCO, July 22.—The California supreme court today affirmed the preliminary order denying a new trial to Thomas J. Mooney, now at San Quentin facing execution for participation in the preparedness day explosion two years ago.
