NO SHEEPSKIN RUGS

LONDON, Aug. 6.—The manufacture of sheepskin rugs has been prohibited by the British army council. This action has been taken because of the requirements of wool and leather for military purposes.

ROCKS SPOUT FIRE IN STORM

(By Associated Press) FLAGSTAFF, Ariz., Aug. 6.—On account of a thrilling experience in a violent electrical storm on the summit of San Francisco peak which stands more than 12,000 feet above sea level was given by Alonzo Wells and George Dible when they were brought to a hospital here for treatment of injuries they suffered during the storm.

They had started to climb the peak during a rain which later turned into a violent hail storm, accompanied by much thunder and lightning. The ground all about them, they said, seemed to be wreathed in strange colored lights and the rocks appeared to spout flames.
