EAST DIVIDE MAKES RAPID PROGRESS

Under the management of Joseph Mayer, the East Divide shaft is making rapid headway toward the 400 foot point. The hole has passed 350 feet and is in the brecciated zone with low values appearing. From this on the headway will be at a better rate, as air will be supplied in a few days from the Alto where a seven drill compressor is being installed. At the Alto, owned by the same interests, a hoist and compressor were unloaded this morning. The foundations are placed for the engine and compressor. This plant includes a seven drill Ingersoll-Rand compressor and a No. 4 Hendrie & Bolthoff hoist. The Alto shaft is down 40 feet in the same formation as the East Divide, the hard tight breccia. The companies are officered by Joseph Mayer, president; John K. Turner, vice president and consulting engineer and Ben Gill, secretary and treasurer. Considering that the Alto only started breaking ground March 2 it is remarkable what progress has been made as the management has set a pace that it would be well for other new companies to follow. Dr. John H. McCann, of Pittsburg, representing Pittsburg and eastern interests which hold control, is spending most of his time on the ground and is confident that the holdings are in safe hands with every promise of bringing in a producer at an early day.
