

SECOND HOTEL FIRE AT SPARKS

The second hotel fire within a week happened Monday morning in Sparks when a two-story frame building owned by F. B. Thompson between Eighth and Ninth streets on C street, was under lease by Riley Thompson and was being used as a boarding house. The damage is estimated at about \$4000, not including the personal property lost by the roomers.

The fire broke out at 4:45 a. m. in the kitchen. The flames spread rapidly before they were discovered, and by the time the fire alarm was sounded the building was completely surrounded in flames.

A dozen or more roomers in the upper story all escaped safely, although it was a close call for several who had to flee without stopping to gather up belongings. Several also had rooms in the old Young's hotel, which burned down last week, so it was their second fire experience within a week.

DIES OF HEMORRHAGE

William Melburn, aged 55 years, was sent to the county hospital last evening on an order from Dr. Richards, county physician, after he had been found suffering from a severe hemorrhage. Melburn did not survive long enough to impart any information about himself, as he died one hour after reaching the hospital. The body is held at the undertaking rooms.

WONDER GROUP IS TAKEN OVER

The Nevada Wonder Mining company has taken an option on the Spider and Wasp mine from the present owners, Dave Craig and El Cam, and it is the understanding that they will begin work on the property at once. The Spider and Wasp mine was discovered by Mr. Craig in 1901, and consists of five patented mining claims situated about four miles west of the Nevada Wonder mine at Waunder.

The mine has been held back by lack of capital, but the present owners succeeded in driving a main shaft down about 200 feet and running several tunnels out from this. They have a hoist, several buildings and complete mining equipment on the property, and the short distance from the Nevada Wonder mine will make it possible for the new owners to work in cooperation with their old property to good advantage. The ore so far has been of good quality, but is a low grade ore.

MINING ENGINEER LOOKS OVER DIVIDE

A. H. Steen, well known mining engineer of Los Angeles and Oakland, Ariz. was in Reno yesterday after spending several days looking over the Divide district in the interest of Eastern and California capital. He was very enthusiastic over the values shown in the new camp and expressed the belief that mining in Nevada is coming into its own again and that the state is entering on a period of prolonged mining activity. SIX MONTHS TO PAY IN VICTORY LOAN

Secretary of the Treasury Carter Glass has announced that subscribers to the Victory Loan will be given six months in which to complete their payments. The dates for payments on the notes are:

- 10% with application before May 10.
- 10% before July 15.
- 20% before August 12.
- 20% before September 9.
- 20% before October 7.
- 20% before November 11.

Payment in full can be made on May 20, ten per cent having been paid with the application before May 10 or payment can be completed on any installment date with accrued interest.

BUSINESS SAYS LOAN WILL GO OVER THE TOP

Peace Conditions Stabilizing Industry to Subscribe to Victory Loan.

As the government's drive for the Victory Loan begins, bankers and business men throughout the country report that slack conditions in trade cannot be given as an excuse for failure to support the campaign.

Commercial failures in the United States for the first two months in 1919 show almost a 50 per cent decrease over the corresponding months of last year, according to a Federal Reserve bulletin just issued. This great improvement in business stability has been achieved despite the fact that the country is passing through a period of readjustment.

Business failures in the United States for February, 1919, were only 459, as compared with 762 for February, 1918. In January, 1919, commercial failures according to statistics compiled by R. G. Dunn & Co., totaled 673, with \$10,736,398 of liabilities, as against 1178 failures for the corresponding month of 1918, with liabilities of \$19,278,787. The failures for January of this year are the smallest in number for any January on record, according to credit men.

With the business and finances of the country thus settling rapidly back to normal, the government does not anticipate any serious trouble in raising the full quota of the fifth loan.

FARMERS COULD PURCHASE ENTIRE U. S. VICTORY LOAN

Earnings for 1918 Estimated at \$12,000,000,000 by Treasury Department.

The farmers of the United States alone could subscribe the entire amount of \$5,000,000,000 to be raised for in the Victory Loan which is to be opened by the government April 21. Figures given out by the treasury department show that the earnings of American farmers for 1918 totalled more than \$12,000,000,000.

Ability of the American people to meet the obligations of its government is shown through figures issued by the treasury department showing the earning power of the nation in 1918 to have been in excess of \$73,000,000,000. It would have taken less than two days' earnings of the American people to pay all the interest charges on all the Liberty Bonds outstanding during that year.

There is far more gold back of a United States government bond than is standing behind bonds of any of the others of the allied nations. America's total wealth is estimated at \$50,000,000,000. The part of the so-called monetary stock held by this country is \$2,079,000,000, an increase of \$1,192,000,000 since the beginning of the war.
