SILVER SELLING FOR \$1.19 3-4

WILSON GOING INTO BELGIUM

(By Associated Press) BRUSSELS, May 12.—President Wilson will visit Brussels about May 24, according to the Independent Deber, which adds his visit will "disperse misunderstandings and establish the good will of the allies toward Belgium." Several projects, it is stated, are under consideration, including the choice of Antwerp as a European commercial base for the United States. The Japanese are now visiting Antwerp with a view to studying collaboration by the Japanese in the reconstruction of Belgium.

GREATEST DAY IN STOCK TRADE

While the transactions on the San Francisco Stock Exchange did not make a record insofar as the aggregate quantity was involved, the amount involved in the sale was far greater than on any day in the history of Southern Nevada. It was a whirlwind market that greeted the Wingfield triplets which were ushered into the trading this morning. Their names are Hercules, Apex and Giant and the youngsters found lively trading with bidding ranging around the 25 spot with a different range of quotations. Apex opened at 25 and closed at 22; Hercules opened at 22, sold at 23 and closed at 21 while Giant was the strongest, opening at 25, selling down to 22 and closing at 24.

ANOTHER INSULT FROM GERMANY

(By Associated Press) BERLIN, (Sunday), May 10.—Germany has seized and unfurled a new banner on which is inscribed Wilson's 14 points, which the president apparently has deserted. President Ebert of Germany said in a statement to the Associated Press. He called the treaty a monstrous document, and declared history holds no precedent for such determination to annihilate a completely vanquished people.

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, May 12.—The Brazilian journalist's attack upon the United States caused a surprise in diplomatic and official circles when it was pointed out that he voiced an opinion of hostility during his seven months' stay in the United States and frequently expressed the friendship of Brazil for the United States.

SENTENCE ANNULLED (By Associated Press) SAN FRANCISCO, May 12.—The United States Circuit Court of Appeals has annulled the sentence of Carl Schiller of Sacramento, to two and a half years imprisonment, and the court held that the evidence did not substantiate the charge of violation of the espionage act.

EXCEED THEIR QUOTAS (By Associated Press) SAN FRANCISCO, May 12.—Northern California counties, exclusive of San Francisco, exceeded their loan quotas by an aggregate of \$6,000,000.

Man of Abiding Faith. N. M. McCormick, while engaged in handling a small trading business, which left some idle hours on his hands, located the Belcher group of three claims in the Gold Mountain district with the conviction that the ground would some day be of great value. For seven years he never wavered in his faith. He was convinced that he would find his reward in later years and straddled to keep possession of the ground which taxed his resources almost to the breaking point. It was doubtful if any one could be found with sufficient nerve to even re- locate the ground if it had been allowed to lapse for as late as 1916.

SEAPLANES PREPARE TO SPREAD WINGS OVERSEAS (By Associated Press) TREPASSEY, May 12.—The American hydroplanes will carry crews of six through the Atlantic's flight from here. Extra men and extra parts, together with a maximum supply of petrol, bringing the weight of each plane to 28,000 pounds, McCormick Towers said might prove more than the motors could lift.
