

WANTS THE U. S. FOR A PARTNER

(By Associated Press) BERLIN, (Tuesday), June 3.—There seems to be a widespread demand by Germans that efforts be made to induce America to enter into a sort of limited alliance with Germany or to take protectorate over this country, giving Germany financial aid and protection and taking in return a lion's share of the profits of Germany's industrial activities.

Prize Counselor Bergman, formerly partner in the German Edison companies and one of the largest electrical magnates, suggests the German American partnership with America as the senior and controlling partner.

NORTHWESTERN TEAMS SCORED

(By Associated Press) SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., June 3.—The poor standing of the two northwestern teams in the Pacific coast league has called forth considerable criticism from both the public and sporting writers. Seattle and Portland, both of whom were elected into the league this season, are the tail-enders in the percentage column, and their percentages are exceedingly low.

The Pacific coast league always has enjoyed the reputation of having a high average quality of clubs and these players have been rated little inferior to those in the major leagues. In fact, for many years both the National and American leagues have drawn largely on the coast for their stars, many of whom are playing on the various big city teams.

Baseball enthusiasts are jealous of the reputation and they are clearly indicating that both Seattle and Portland should bestir themselves and strengthen their clubs so as to maintain the interest of the public whose attendance thus far this season practically has been a record for sustained numbers.

SPANISH BELT MINES OPENING BIG RESERVES

(Continued from Page One.)

The Trona company has made a commercial success of the production of borax as a by-product of the potash industry. Their present output averages over 20 tons per day of standard borax. This will shortly be increased to over 40 tons per day, the capacity of the present plant.

Dr. H. W. Morse, the manager of the Trona company states that the cost of producing this borax, over and above the cost of producing potash, is less than \$5 per ton of borax. This result has practically doubled the commercial value of Searles lake. The potash market remains demoralized. Considerable Alsatian potash is now being sold in the United States at about \$1.75 per unit. Both the Trona and the Borosolway are selling small lots of high-grade potash at about \$2 per unit. This is in the chemical trade.

The Trona company has over 5000 tons of about 85 per cent KCl on hand at Searles lake besides some stored in the east. The Borosolway has about 3000 tons of 85 per cent or 90 per cent of KCl on hand at Searles lake.

Both companies are working principally to perfect processes and not to make production. Therefore the Trona output remains at about 2000 tons per month and the Borosolway about 600 tons per month. Both plants can practically double their output if a satisfactory market develops.

The new evaporators at the Borosolway plant are a complete success.
