TIPPING SYSTEM CLOSES HOTELS

ROME, June 14.—Restaurant waiters have been recently veritable ancient Ciceroni in Rome for they have controlled both the public and the hotel and restaurant proprietors. Romans cannot eat outside the confines of their own homes for there is now no place to eat. All restaurants are closed.

The quarrel is on the unending subjects of tips. It has been the policy during some weeks to include the tip in the bill. At the end of each day, the waiter's share would amount to 20 per cent of the gross receipts in some cases. The proprietors found that this procedure was not acceptable to the guests, and asked the waiters to return to the former system of voluntary tipping. They refused.

The refusal culminated in a strike. Some hotels were forced to accede to the demands of the waiters and in these alone was anyone able to procure food. Because these hotels were the only ones in which people could be served, the waiters clashed with the patrons. Italian officers accompanied by women were insulted while a dignified British general, just returned from the campaign in Palestine, was subjected to a somewhat torturous exhortation.

LONDON, June 15.—Having read in an American paper of a campaign launched over there to promote cheerfulness, a London reporter made a tour to see if such a campaign would help this metropolis. "It would do no harm," was the upshot of his impressions.

A superficial investigation in the city, he writes, "revealed the presence of a surprising number of people who appeared to be feeling the seriousness of their position." The most gloomy looking were restaurant floor walkers, underground lift attendants, shop assistants, policemen, foreign waiters, tube gatemen, tram conductors, messengers in government offices, theater-bookings office clerks, jewelers, teashop waitresses, railway porters and sentries outside Buckingham palace.

"Not one," he says, "was observed to smile. Teashop waitresses appeared to be suffering from 'soul sickness.' Assistants in most shops (an American department store excepted) appeared to regard the advent of a customer as a flippant intrusion on their meditations."


GUST BUKATIOTIS OF MCGILL SUFFOCATED IN ORE BIN

Gust Bukatiotis, known locally as Gust Bourgas, a Greek, 29 years old, met his death in an ore bin at the concentrator of the Nevada Consolidated Copper company at McGill on Wednesday morning. Bukatiotis was employed as a laborer and it was his duty to keep the ore from clogging in the bins after it had been dumped from the cars and as it was drawn off from the underneath on its way into the mill. There were no eyewitnesses to the accident but it is supposed that in poking at the ore from above with a long iron bar he lost his balance and fell into the bin and was smothered in the masses of fine ore.—Ely Record.

RED CROSS AID FOR COSSACKS

NAZAIRE, June 11.—A Red Cross mission to take 3000 tons of clothing, food and medical supplies to the Cossack soldiers and civilians of the Kuban district of Russia, on the eastern coast of the Black Sea, will soon leave here headed by Major Robert Davis of New York City, and Captain Henry Adams of Boston. The expedition has an army field hospital of 500 beds and several soup kitchens. These supplies will be landed at Novorissk on the Black Sea.
