Glanders in the Cat Family.
Glanders is an ailment usually associated with horses, but an outbreak of this disease among the lions and tigers of the Rome Zoological garden is reported in the Annals d'Igiene. The disease is known to have been transmitted from horses to lions, tigers and leopards, and the domestic cat was shown susceptible by laboratory inoculation.

Turtle's Instinct.
It has long ago been ascertained that the eggs of the loggerhead turtle are laid to the sand at some distance from the sea. As soon as the young are hatched, however, they move with unerring instinct to the water. It is found that newly hatched loggerhead turtles move away from red, orange and green, but are attracted by blue. Under normal conditions, then, the blue gleam of the sea may be supposed to attract them, while they will turn away from the reds and greens of the land.

Homing Instinct Supreme.

It makes no noise as it flies, because its feathers are soft and fluffy, but as it darts past you sometimes it utters a sort of groan. The nighthawk occasionally gives vent to a loud "yawk" as it flies through the evening air.
