BEER DECISION TEXT RECEIVED

SAN FRANCISCO, July 19—The decision by which a federal judge in Boston last Tuesday quashed indictments charging two brewers in that city with selling beer containing one-half of 1 per cent of alcohol in its point with federal charges against Louis Heinrich and Rudolph Samet, San Francisco brewers in the opinion of Theodore A. Bell, their attorney who received by telegraph yesterday the Boston ruling. The Boston decision said:

The demurrer to this information raises simply the question as to whether the act of November 21, 1918, prohibits the sale of non-intoxicating beer. The government admits that the word 'intoxicating' was omitted from the information for the purpose of raising as a question of law the right to sell a non-intoxicating beverage commonly called beer.

I am perfectly clear that no such strained construction should be placed upon this statute which was passed for the purpose of conserving the man power of the nation and to increase the efficiency in the production of arms, munitions, ships, food and clothing for the army and navy by prohibiting the use of intoxicating liquor as a beverage.
