DEAD MAN WAS A MUSICIAN

The body found lying on the slope of Mount Brougher yesterday afternoon was identified during the evening as that of Chat Rea, a member in good standing of Tonopah Musician's Union. Deceased had been employed at the Mint and, when last seen, manifested no signs of despondency but the circumstances attending death lead to the belief that he ended his own life. An empty vial and a medicine dropper were found near the body.

Deceased was 27 years of age and came from Fairfield, Ida., where his parents reside. In his possession was a letter from his mother urging him to return home and stating that transportation would be furnished as soon as he signified his intention of going back. Arrangements for the funeral will be completed as soon as an inquest is held.

This afternoon Frank J. Cavanaugh received a message from the dead man's mother stating that she was coming to Tonopah and to hold the body until her arrival.
